

## 9-12 District Test Coordinator Bulletin May 2020

### **New! OELPA Scores**

Results of the Spring 2020 Ohio English Language Proficiency Assessment (OELPA) administration will be reported to districts in the [Online Reporting System](#) on **May 11, 2020**.

All students who submitted tests will receive scores and a proficiency status of Proficient, Progressing or Emerging. This includes those students who did not complete all required domain tests due to the ordered school-building closure, or other reasons such as spring break or absence. Questions regarding English learners who have untested domains due to the ordered school-building closure require federal guidance. Until guidance is received, students receive the indicated scores.

- **Students who score Proficient.** Students who achieve a proficiency status of Proficient will exit English learner status and be reclassified accordingly.
- **Students who score Progressing or Emerging.** For students who achieve a proficiency status of Progressing or Emerging, schools will determine and provide the appropriate services to ensure students' development of English language proficiency and access to the curriculum.

Printed OELPA Family Reports, originally planned for delivery the week of June 8, 2020, will be sent to districts when school buildings reopen.

### **New! Return of AASCD Spring 2020 Testing Materials**

Districts are requested to return spring 2020 AASCD secure testing materials to the vendor when the district feels it is safe to return to the building to do so. Districts that are returning materials should contact the Ohio Help Desk at 1-877-231-7809 and select option 7, or email the Ohio Help Desk at [ohhelpdesk@air.org](mailto:ohhelpdesk@air.org) and provide the date and time range for the pickup (please provide the earliest available pickup time and the latest). Districts may also drop-off their secure materials directly to a UPS store for return shipment.

Districts that are not returning to the building within the next few weeks should continue to retain the materials under the proper security procedures that are outlined in the [AASCD Test Administration Manual](#) until such time as they can return them safely.

Secure test materials for the AASCD are the following:

- test booklets
- stimulus booklets
- paper response options (including the plastic bags that they were packaged in)

- optional student response forms (if used)

### **Family Score Reports for Fall 2019 End-of-Course Tests**

With the ordered school-building closure, the shipment of family score reports for the fall 2019 high school administration are being held. Please look for future communication regarding the shipment of the family reports. Districts may print Individual Score Reports from the Online Reporting System.

### **New! ACT/SAT Fall 2020 Tentative Dates**

For the state-sponsored ACT and SAT tests, the Department is exploring fall opportunities for districts and students that were scheduled to test in spring but were unable to do so.

- Tentative dates for **ACT** fall testing are Sept. 22, Oct. 6 and Oct. 22. Any fall state-sponsored ACT test administrations will be conducted in paper format only.
- Fall **SAT** testing dates are tentatively scheduled for Sept. 23 and Oct. 14 with make-up testing Oct. 28. Any fall state-sponsored SAT test administrations will be conducted in paper format only.

The Department will provide more information on options for these additional testing opportunities as soon as possible.

### **Online Testing Technology: 2020-2021**

Reminder: Microsoft stopped supporting Windows 7, Windows Server 2008 and 2008 R2 after Jan. 14, 2020. Microsoft will no longer provide security patches or updates for these operating systems. When an operating system manufacturer ends support for an operating system in the middle of the school year, the Department maintains support for that operating system until the end of the school year. Testing support for Windows 7 will no longer be available after the 2019-2020 school year. Schools and districts that have not upgraded from Windows 7 by the end of the school year must plan to do so before the start of the 2020-2021 school year.
