State Activity

Introduced Bills

<u>Senate Bill 316</u> (Lehner, R-Kettering), to revise the laws governing type B family day-care homes and to revise authorizations and conditions with respect to education, workforce development and early childhood care

House Education Committee

The House Education Committee will meet on Wednesday, March 28 at 5:00 PM in Room 313 of the Statehouse to hear the following bills:

<u>House Bill 462</u> (Pelanda, R-Marysville), with respect to a school districts withholding or transfer to another district or school the grades and credits of a child who is alleged or adjudicated an abused, neglected or dependent child- 1st hearing- sponsor testimony

<u>House Bill 444</u> (Henne, R- Clayton), to authorize a pilot program for school districts in Montgomery County to operate certain for-profit activities- 2nd hearing- proponent testimony

<u>House Bill 437</u> (Roegner, R-Hudson/ Patmon, D-Cleveland), to increase the number of miles a school board may authorize its motor vehicles for out-of-state travel- 2nd hearing- proponent testimony

<u>House Bill 191</u> (Hayes, R-Harrison Township), to establish a minimum school year based on hours, rather than days, or instruction and to prohibit public schools from being open for instruction prior to Labor Day except in specified circumstances- 6th hearing- possible substitute bill
