Last Friday, we provided Ohio school superintendents with an FAQ regarding the decision to delay the release of the 2011-2012 Local Report Card and detailed guidance for implementing the recently passed revisions to the Third-Grade Reading Guarantee. While the Reading Guarantee provisions are drawing quite a bit of attention because almost immediate action is required this school year, there are several other recent legislative changes which also require action during the 2012-2013 school year.

To assist you in identifying, planning for and meeting these requirements, we have developed a handy summary of newly legislated responsibilities and their effective/due dates contained within SB316. In addition to the Third-Grade Reading Guarantee requirements, the document offers a summary of new regulations including: data reporting; teacher evaluations; kindergarten enrollment and transfer; and teacher evaluation. Sample science and social studies test questions temporarily offline

Due to unforeseen circumstances, the science and social studies sample items mentioned in last weeks' EdConnection are not currently available for viewing. Over the next few weeks, our vendor American Institutes for Research has agreed to build and host a non-password protected website so these items can be easily available for public viewing. We will share that link with you when the sample science and social studies questions are available.

Update OEDS information now to stay informed

The Ohio Educational Directory System (OEDS) is an important tool used to transmit news and communications from ODE to the field. Additionally, the information contained in OEDS is used for a variety of data systems, such as Comprehensive Consolidated Improvement Plan (CCIP), and the Secure Data Center (SDC). Since ODE uses OEDS throughout the year, it is necessary for districts to keep information updated for superintendents, principals, email addresses, administrative roles and grade spans served by the buildings. ODE encourages districts to update this information, preferably at the beginning of a new school year.

So you are aware, the Office of Accountability has captured from OEDS the information that will be displayed on the 2011-2012 local report cards. As such, now is an ideal time for districts to enter and update information in OEDS for the 2012-2013 school year. Electronic Teacher and Principal Evaluation System (eTPES) opens Sept. 4

ODE has developed and is making available an electronic tool, eTPES, to help streamline the teacher and/or principal evaluation process. eTPES will be used this school year for those fully implementing new teacher and/or principal evaluation systems based on RttT, HB 153 and SB 316. Districts that are not fully implementing OTES or OPES may take this opportunity to review and use the system, but will not be asked to report ratings until they are fully implementing.

On **Sept. 4**, initial access to the <https://www.OhioTPES.com> (eTPES) product will open only for LEA superintendents and their designees. While superintendents may identify a designee for eTPES, a designee is not required. This approach enables LEA leadership to determine the type of eTPES deployment preferred and the rollout schedule for their local school district or community school. A superintendent designee listed in the Ohio Education Directory System (OEDS) will receive the same level of eTPES access and authority as the superintendent or community school leader. Superintendents and superintendent designees listed in OEDS will receive an e-mail with further information on Sept. 4.

A superintendent or community school leader who chooses to have a designee for eTPES should identify that person and contact the LEA's local OEDS administrator to enter that information in OEDS before Sept. 4.

An Alignment Tool is provided in eTPES for districts to demonstrate alignment of their teacher performance rubric to the OTES rubric (if an alternative rubric is being used). The first step in eTPES begins with the alignment process. Upon completion, the user continues to Step 2. Districts using an alternative rubric are required to demonstrate alignment of the rubric to the OTES rubric prior to reporting performance ratings.

As part of the roll-out, support will be provided in the form of user manuals, online help screens, technology support and live and recorded webinars.

Ohio Principal Evaluation System (OPES) available

A district policy for the new OPES must be in place by July 1, 2013, and be effective for the 2013-2014 school year. However, per the LEA's Race to the Top scope of work, some LEAs may use the system sooner than the required date. Now that OPES is aligned with the Ohio Teachers Evaluation System (OTES), all those who will be evaluating principals will need to complete state-sponsored training and pass an online assessment.

The online assessment will be available beginning in September. Any principal evaluator who has already

participated in an OPES training must pass an online assessment. Those evaluators may, but are not required to, take refresher training before completing the online assessment. Any principal evaluator who has yet to take the state-sponsored, two-day training will need to do so. Beginning in September, additional OPES training dates and sessions will be listed in [STARS](#). Information about the online OPES assessment will be sent by e-mail directly to superintendents and to those who have completed the state-sponsored training.

Schools may apply for grants to defray travel costs to Statehouse

The 2012-2013 Ohio Statehouse School Transportation Program will begin accepting online applications beginning at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 4 for grants to defray travel costs for trips to the Ohio Statehouse and Museum this school year. Grants will be offered to any Ohio school that receives state funding and will be planning a trip for students in grades 4-12. The Capitol Square Review and Advisory Board (CSRAB) and the Capitol Square Foundation conduct the transportation grant program.

Please apply early, as grants will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, according to the order in which qualifying applications are received. A total of 240 grants are available, with 80 grants awarded in each of three categories based on proximity to the Statehouse. Schools less than 50 miles from the Statehouse will be reimbursed \$200, schools between 51 and 100 miles away will be reimbursed \$300 and schools at least 101 miles away will be reimbursed \$400. Remember requirement to observe Constitution Day on Sept. 17

Each year, schools nationwide help students understand the U.S. Constitution and its significance by commemorating Constitution Day. This year, the event will be celebrated on Monday, Sept. 17, which is the 225th anniversary of the signing of the U.S. Constitution. Educational institutions receiving federal funds are [required](#) to plan an educational program celebrating Constitution Day. ODE encourages schools to involve all students in grades K-12 in the celebration. As you plan your program, you may want to consider the following suggestions:

- Invite all teachers, parents and other community members when planning school-wide events;
- Engage students in meaningful activities aligned to the school's curriculum and the Ohio academic content standards;
- Plan programs with the current course of study in mind, connecting the topics and themes of Constitution Day to age-appropriate activities and grade-level content;
- Although Constitution Day is a once-a-year event, continue the study and discussion of our rights and responsibilities as U.S. citizens throughout the school year.
