Description

The Agriculture Education Fifth Quarter Grant is a state-funded grant targeting year-round instruction. It was developed to assist schools and career centers provide supplemental resources to ensure delivery of instruction to develop student entrepreneurial activity and work-based learning experience through organized supervised agricultural experience. The funds provide an additional revenue stream for local education agencies to assist them in providing the Agriculture Education Fifth Quarter goal of year-round instruction and data collection to validate student work-based learning experiences, income, and efficiency factors related to supervised agricultural experiences.

Requirements

Only local education agencies approved by the Office of Career-Technical Education as a pathway provider in the Agricultural and Environmental Systems Career Field who are committed to year-round instructional activities with direct supervision of students by their teachers of agriculture may apply. The local education agency must demonstrate a need for the funds and a plan for implementing year-round supervised agricultural experiences as outlined in the Funding Application in the Comprehensive Continuous Improvement Plan (CCIP). Funding for the grant begins July 1, 2022 and runs through June 30, 2023.

Competitive Grant Applications for the Agriculture Education Fifth Quarter Grant FY2023 opens Monday, May 2, 2022 and shall close Thursday, June 30, 2022 at 11:59 PM EST. Grants shall be Authorized Representative Approved on or before the application close date to be considered for funding regardless of prior grant awards.
