Projected Growth of Health Science Jobs in Ohio (2031)




Figure 1 shows the highest in-demand occupations projected for 2031 in the Health Science career field, with Registered Nurses topping the list with almost 134,000 jobs in Ohio in 2031.

Figure 2 demonstrates the projected growth over the next ten years as a percentage. The blue represents positive growth, with the highest projected growth of 56% in Fitness Trainers and Aerobics Instructors. The red represents negative growth or a decrease in the number of jobs, with the greatest expected decrease in Pharmacy Aides.

Top Companies for Health Science Jobs in Ohio




Figure 3 shows the top companies hiring in the Health Science career field over a one-year period (October 2020-October 2021). There was a total of 307,822 health science job postings during this time period, with the highest number from Cleveland Clinic at 12,182.

Demand and Supply of Health Science Jobs in Ohio




Figure 4 shows the demand and supply ratio for different areas in the career field. The ratio is calculated using the formula, job openings divided by the sum of graduates and those unemployed in the field [Ratio= Openings/(Graduates+Unemployed)]. A ratio of one or greater demonstrates a potential undersupply and less than one shows a sufficient supply. Transportation and Material Moving and Production Occupations are in potential undersupply.




Figure 5 shows the top 27 in-demand hard skills employers are looking for in health science jobs, with the top skill being Nursing. Additionally, the darker blue demonstrates skills that have seen a greater increase in demand from 2017 to 2021. The greatest increase in demand is in Activities of Daily Living (ADLs) and Caregiving at 378% and 376%, respectively.

Demand for Soft Skills in Health Science Jobs in Ohio




Figure 6 shows the top 27 in-demand soft skills employers are looking for in health science jobs. The top skill is communications, which appeared in almost 44,000 job postings between January 2021 and June 2021. Additionally, the darker blue demonstrates skills that have seen a greater increase in demand from 2017 to 2021. The greatest increase in demand is in Valid Driver's License and Lifting Ability at 607% and 222%, respectively.
