EDUCATION PRIORITIES

Literacy: Every student reading at or above grade level



Learning acceleration: Every student accelerates their learning in ELA and math through proactive, evidenced-based, and individualized supports they need to succeed.



Student wellness: Learning environments are safe, supportive and healthy so that students are ready to learn.



Workforce readiness: Every student leaves the Ohio K-12 system with the knowledge, skills, and experiences to be part of a dynamically skilled, productive, and purposeful workforce. Ohio employers has access to a skilled, productive workforce.



COUNCIL OFFICERS

The Advisory Council will elect a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary to serve 2-year terms

- Chair: the Chair will preside over all meetings and in consultation Department set the Advisory Council's agenda and schedule Advisory Council meetings.
- Vice-Chair: the Vice-Chair will assist in facilitating the meetings and handle all duties of the Chair in the Chair's absence.
- Secretary: the Secretary will, with the assistance of Department Staff, ensure that minutes are taken and available for public inspection.



ADOPTION OF BYLAWS



REVIEW OF COUNCIL CHARGE

- Work collaboratively with the Department to review all existing rules and guidance relating to dropout recovery community schools
- Represent a variety of stakeholders to communicate interests and concerns of the dropout prevention and recovery community
- Promote the identification of best practices for dropout prevention and recovery schools
- Make recommendations to the Department regarding legislative changes related to dropout prevention and recovery schools



OVERVIEW OF REPORT CARD



DROPOUT RECOVERY RULES AND GUIDANCE

- OAC 3301-102-10(A)(2) sets for criteria for students in DOPR programs
 - Students in DOPR program are age 16-21
 - Students are academically 1 year behind, or crisis interferes with learning
 - Program Requires students to attain designated score on state assessments
 - Individual Career Plan specifies student will enroll in a 2-year degree program, acquire an industry credential, or enroll in an apprenticeship
 - Program provides counseling and support
 - Instructional program demonstrates how content standards are taught and assessed



DROPOUT RECOVERY RULES AND GUIDANCE

• OAC 3301-102-10(D) sets for report card performance measures

- Graduation Rate for 4-year cohort
- Graduation Rate for 5,6,7,8-year cohorts
- Passage rate for 12th grade students and those 3 months of their 22nd birthday on state assessments
- Annual Measurable Objectives (student Progress)
- OAC 3301-102-11 sets forth the requirements for the nationally normed testing used for the progress measure (currently Renaissance STAR)
- OAC 3301-102-12 sets for the cut scores for the state report card.
