Sponsor Evaluation Process

Purpose

- Assist the Department in providing oversight and technical assistance to sponsors
- Improve the quality of sponsor practices
- Improve community school operations and academic performance

Sponsor Evaluations (ORC 3314.016)

Three Equally-Weighted Components

- Academic performance
- Compliance with all laws and rules
- Adherence to quality practices

2016-2017 Sponsor Evaluations

Which sponsors are being evaluated?

- Any sponsor that is currently sponsoring a school

2016-2017 Sponsor Evaluations

Differences from the 2015-2016 sponsor evaluations:


- Academic Performance
 - No differences
- Compliance with all laws and rules
 - Updated spreadsheet for ease of use

Differences from the 2015-2016 sponsor evaluations (continued):

- Quality Practices
 - Updated and streamlined the quality rubric
 - Improved the document upload process in Epicenter



Overall Sponsor Rating for 2016-2017

- If the sponsor scores 0 points on one of the three components, then the overall rating cannot be better than “Ineffective”
- If the sponsor scores 0 points on two of the three components, then the overall rating cannot be better than “Poor”

Calculating 2016-2017 Overall Rating & Score

Example 1: Sponsor A

- Has 3 community schools in its portfolio
- Academic performance rating of “C”
- Compliance rating of “Exemplary”
- Quality practice rating of “Meets Standards”

Sponsor Evaluation Outcomes



Outcomes of Sponsor Evaluation Ratings

- **Determines eligibility to sponsor any new or additional community schools**
- **Impacts Department decisions about:**
 - Renewal of sponsorship agreements;
 - Sponsorship application and approval; and
 - Revocation of sponsorship.

Overall Sponsor Evaluation Performance Ratings

- Exemplary
- Effective
- Ineffective
- Poor

Outcomes for an Exemplary Rating

- May sponsor new or additional community schools
- Sponsored community schools may apply for a Charter School Program (CSP) Grant*

*Additional risk factors may apply

Outcomes for an Exemplary Rating

Exemplary for two or more consecutive years

Sponsor may participate in the following incentives:

- Renewal of sponsorship agreement with the Department
- Ability to extend contract term with school beyond the term included in agreement with the Department
- Exemption from preliminary agreement and contract adoption and execution deadline requirements

Outcomes for an Exemplary Rating

Exemplary for two or more consecutive years (continued)

- Exemption from automatic contract expiration requirement if a new school fails to open by Sept. 30 of the year in which the contract is executed
- No limit on the number of community schools sponsored
- No territorial restrictions on sponsorship*

*May be subject to other statutory provisions

Outcomes for an Effective Rating

- May sponsor new or additional community schools
- Sponsored community schools may apply for a Charter School Program (CSP) Grant*

*Additional risk factors may apply

Outcomes for an Ineffective Rating

- Cannot sponsor any new or additional community schools
- Must develop a quality improvement plan with the Department

Outcomes for an Ineffective Rating

Ineffective for three consecutive years

- Sponsorship revocation
- Sponsor may appeal the revocation within 30 days of receiving the rating
- Revocation will not occur until the appeal process is finished

Outcomes for a Poor Rating

- Sponsorship revocation
- Sponsor may appeal the revocation within 30 days of receiving the rating
- Revocation will not occur until the appeal process is finished

Sponsorship Revocation

- Schools are assumed by the Office of School Sponsorship (OSS) at the Department for the remainder of the school year
- OSS may continue to sponsor the schools for up to two years from sponsor revocation or until the schools find a new sponsor, whichever comes first

Submitting Documentation for the Sponsor Evaluation

Document Submission

- Documents must be uploaded into Epicenter
- Required submission types will be listed in the sponsor's task queue
- Use correct submission type

*A submission type is the title given to a request for documentation within the Department's online platform, Epicenter.

Document Submission

Document submission windows:

- Academic Performance: None
- Compliance: February 3 – June 30
- Quality Practice: February 3 – April 30

Document Submission

Sponsors can replace documents in Epicenter (if needed) until the document submission window closes

Once the window closes, documents cannot be added, replaced, or removed

Document Submission

Please make sure that:

- All confidential, personally identifiable information (e.g. address, phone number, SSN, etc.) is removed or redacted prior to uploading
- Student and parent names are removed or redacted
- No school safety plans are uploaded
- Uploaded files can be opened and are easy to read

2016-2017 Sponsor Evaluations

- Maintain the rigor of the 2015-2016 process while streamlining the evaluation tools and improving ease of use
- Updated evaluation tools and process based on public comments and stakeholder feedback



Overall Sponsor Ratings

The Ohio Department of Education, with input from the stakeholders, the National Association of Charter School Authorizers and an impartial panel of experts, has created one of the most comprehensive sponsor evaluation systems in the country—which will lead to more high-quality options for Ohio students. The evaluation system, and other measures in Ohio's charter school reform law, significantly strengthen the accountability structures that govern Ohio's charter schools, state oversight of sponsors and operator transparency.

The three components of the [framework](#) are:

- » Alignment of academic performance to Ohio's report card;
- » Compliance with laws and administrative rules; and
- » Adherence to quality sponsor practice

What's a Sponsor? - A sponsor has the authority (ability) to establish a community school. Sponsors ensure that schools adhere to their contracts, and they make important decisions, such as whether to renew contracts with community schools. They also provide oversight and technical assistance.

What's a Community School? - Community schools, which are often called charter schools nationally and in other states, are public schools created in Ohio law; are independent of any school district; and are part of the state's education program. Community schools are public schools of choice and are state and federally funded.
