# **Meeting Minutes**

# Approval of June 2021 Meeting Minutes

• Amber Myers moved to approve the minutes from the June 8 meeting. Crystal Aker provided the second. The minutes were approved without objection.

# Updates on Student Claiming Module (SCM)

- A soft release occurred earlier this fall. The elease was delayed to allow work on performance issues in ODDEX. To date, just over 400 students have been claimed.
- Why student claiming?
  - Earlier access to student records
  - Earlier notification to the district a student is leaving
  - Fewer incorrect SSIDs
  - o Improved grade placement of new students
  - o Better high school graduation planning
- Options in the SCM
  - New menu bar option in ODDEX
  - Can claim a new student, review prior claims related to your district, and cancel claims of students not yet reported as enrolled in SCR
- The Claiming Process
  - Five basic steps to claiming a student
  - Each page has a bar across the top
  - Bar will grow as you complete each step for a student
  - May have multiple screens for the same step
  - Only way to return to an earlier step is to cancel or exit the current claim and start again

## Other Reports for ODDEX

- o Currently, reports in ODDEX are limited
  - Data dump
  - Screen print
- o SLDS project will add PDF report options
- Need to test how PDF reports will work
- Brainstorming: 3 useful reports to add to existing ODDEX modules



- Filter down enrollment data to open enrolled out students
- o Filter out or sort tools for assessment

## **Progress Towards Graduation**

- Requirements are complex- establish a shared format for understanding a student's progress (especially transfers!)
- Also create school and district level reports for administrators to allow for planning and monitoring
- Formats at a high level (including for parents) as well as formats showing all the detailed data that went into showing requirements as met or not
- PDF reports to make it easy to share

## **Progress Towards Graduation- Basic Requirements**

- The following questions were proposed to the workgroup and their feedback is documented below:
  - What are the problems/challenges you face around tracking students meeting graduation requirements?
    - Would be helpful to have something to mirror Google doc that districts have currently
    - Gaps and nuances between:
      - Physical science, chemistry, and advanced biology
      - PE waivers
      - Financial literacy
    - In need of supplemental guidance documents for these gaps/nuances
    - Pain points with SIS will surface those issues
  - What aspects of graduation tracking are most repetitive and/or take the most of your time?
  - What do you need to better understand about student status in meeting grad requirements?
    - Layers of flexibility (i.e. COVID)
  - Same question for administrators?
    - Group level reports that give counts to quickly see if there are certain courses that a lot of kids are having trouble getting credit in.
    - Explain cohorts and pathways
    - Summary reports would be helpful
  - Same question for parents/students?
    - Good visual for student to take and use so they can understand and share with their parents to understand their progress towards graduation
    - One page for what is required and what each student currently has
    - Confusion for parents especially around the seals
    - Document would need to be in multiple languages/translated



 Would be nice to have integration with SIS so parents and students could see in their local progress application their grades along with their progress towards graduation

# Progress Towards Graduation- Report Defaults and User Interface

- Quick review- menu for PTG module
  - One workgroup member suggested user determined groups
- Quick review- report selection interface
  - Feedback from the group was that the organization makes sense and is very clear.

# **Progress Towards Graduation- Reports on Individual Students**

- Further discussions took place on the reports for individual students. Questions and feedback are documented below:
  - Review examples of possible report topics
    - Ad hoc reports that are customizable. Hard to predict.
      - (i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> period students)
    - Readiness (what the student said they wanted to achieve versus what they've actually achieved)
  - Additional ideas from the group?
    - Local ID known by parent and student instead of SSID
      - Is there a concern with ODE having local ID?
        - Historically ODE stayed away from having local ID in case it was SSN. More of a security safeguard
        - Most districts have moved away from using SSN as local ID
        - Check with ITC to see if any students still have 9 digit local ID number
    - Should there be demographic information?
      - No for PDF/web view (this information is too sensitive)
      - Yes for CSV
    - Cohort listed in header, but also need to know when they entered ninth grade

## **Progress Towards Graduation- Reports on Groups of Students**

- Possible groupings:
  - Entire District/Community School
  - By Building
  - o By Grad Cohort Year
  - By Current Grade Level
  - o By Race/Ethnicity
  - o Disability Y/N
    - Not by disability condition
  - Economically Disadvangement Y/N



- English Learner Y/N
- Foster/Adjuticated Youth Y/N
- Homeless Y/N
- Additional ideas from the group?
  - Gifted Y/N not in current system but could be added
  - o Migrant
  - Entered Ninth Grade
  - CCP on a credit report
  - o Cumulative FTE for district
  - o Student level attendance rate
  - Having data to be able to access, manipulate however a district wants in order to possible answer questions from local board of educations or other stakeholders

#### **Upcoming Focus Groups**

- Many focus groups needed throughout the project
- Small groups (usually 5-8) so that a conversation can take place, but we can have multiple groups for the same topic
- Will invite volunteers from the volunteer pool to RSVP for specific groups
- Should be able to accommodate all volunteers, but may be staff capacity limits in some cases
- For each group, ODE will share:
  - The Focus Question(s) for the group
  - A description of the background of the ideal volunteers
  - The time commitment (number of sessions and length) for the specific group
  - Any requested preparation for volunteers to complete before the first meeting (such as reviewing a document)
  - The desired outcome of the session(s)
- Three focus groups between Dec 8-16. Each virtual session will be 30-45 minutes.
  - Basic Progress Towards Graduation Requirements
    - Discuss the basic need (requirements) for a system to track and present progress towards graduation for individual students and groups of students.
  - Individual Student Progress Towards Graduation Reports
    - Discuss the types of individual student graduation progress reports that would help you, students and their parents, and your school move students towards graduation.
  - Student Group Progress Towards Graduation Reports
    - Discuss the types of student group reports (such as reports by building, by grade level, and/or by demographic attributes) that would help you and your school move groups of students towards graduation.
