At the end of the course, the trainee receives an official card from the health organization. ⇒ First Aid and CPR may be combined. The training must be appropriate for all age groups the program is currently serving. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ Blended courses (which combine online/electronic media methods with in-person training) may be taught by an approved health organization and used to meet rule requirements if an in-person skills assessment is completed. 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Child Abuse Recognition and Prevention	<p>IN-PERSON TRAINING: "Keeping Children Safe: Child Abuse and Neglect Curriculum for Early Childhood Professionals"</p> <p>(Six hour course developed in collaboration with Ohio Children's Trust Fund)</p>	<p><u>Trainers must be one of the following:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ An authorized trainer for a public children's services agency (PCSA). ⇒ A person with at least an associate's degree in social work, child development or related field from an accredited college AND two years experience in professionally assessing child abuse and neglect for a PCSA or an agency contracted by a PCSA or providing counseling to abused children or training others in child abuse prevention or the combination of experience and training. ⇒ A licensed physician or registered nurse with two years of experience professionally assessing child abuse and neglect or providing counseling to abused children or training others in child abuse prevention or the combination of experience and training. <p><u>Please note the following course content requirements:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ⇒ The initial course is a six hour training. ⇒ The training is valid for three years. ⇒ The training must cover the topics outlined in Appendix A to 5101:2-12-10 and 5101:2-12-13 of the OAC
