For Initial Evaluations this group includes:

For Reevaluations, the IEP team is the qualified team and includes:

1. Parent
2. General education teacher
3. Special education provider
4. At least two representatives of the school district who collectively meet specific requirements
5. Other individuals who have knowledge or special expertise

## PRESCHOOL AGE ELIGIBILITY 3301-51-11 (G)(4)

- Must be at least 3 and not 6
- Exceptions:
- Younger than 3
- If age eligible for Kindergarten, but not compulsory school age under the following conditions:
- Consideration for school-age services
- As of April 6, 2023,
- No longer required to conduct reevaluation prior to age 6 for children under the category of Developmental Delay
