Delivery of Services/Least Restrictive Environment in Ohio Administrative Code 3301-51-11(J)(1-5)

This document is intended to support preschool administrators, teachers, intervention specialists, school psychologists and related service providers regarding the Delivery of Services and Least Restrictive Environment section of the revised Preschool Special Education rule 3301-51-11. The information contained in this document is to serve as a resource in the following areas: definitions of continuum terms, locations of educational services continuum, educator qualification requirements and itinerant services.

Definitions of Least Restrictive Environment Continuum 3301-51-11(A)(1)

LRE Continuum Term	Rule Definition	Further Clarification from Rule or examples (The examples shown may not reflect all possible scenarios.)
Co-taught class	A class operated by a public school, educational service center, or county board of developmental disabilities that is taught by two licensed teachers: one licensed general education teacher and one licensed intervention specialist	Teachers: • Both teachers are assigned to the classroom for the full duration of each class session • All children in the co-taught class are on the general education teacher's roster; the children with disabilities are also counted in the intervention specialists' caseload. Class Size & Makeup: • Max of 8 children with disabilities • Follows general education licensing rules for ratio and group size requirements Example: • General education preschool classroom with 20 children (12 children with out disabilities and 8 children with disabilities). Both teachers lead the class which meets 4 days a week 3hrs and 15 min. per day.

Beginning July 1, 2020, includes a A maximum of eight six children with disabilities (i.e., children with IEPs) enrolled in a public school preschool general education class that is taught by a general education teacher who meets the lead qualifications outlined in paragraph (A)(1)(a)(ii) of this rule, and the class must be made up of fifty per cent or fewer have more children without disabilities enrolled than children without disabilities; the department may grant a waiver (on a case-by-case basis) for additional children with disabilities to be enrolled.

DEVELOPMENTAL DELAY 3301-51-11 (D)(1)

Districts may use the term under the following conditions:

- Based upon individual needs of the child
- Evaluation Results
- Areas of Delay

Requirement to rule out other categories was removed.

As of April 6, 2023, a child may enter kindergarten with this disability category.



INTERAGENCY AGREEMENTS 3301-51-11 (D)(2)

- No change in requirements for partnerships between the district and:
 - Head Start
 - Early Intervention
 - Boards of DD
 - Educational Service Centers
- District required to engage in annual review of plan
- Shared responsibilities



*Strengthened language regarding the program administrator's responsibility for collaboration with all regional childcare providers



TRANSITION FROM PART C EARLY INTERVENTION 3301-51-11 (D)(3)(A)(I)

Cannot delay for residency disputes or absence of birth certificate

30-day period to obtain documentation and confirm residency

Part C referral date will be the earliest of the following:

If TPC or first notification more than 150 days before 3rd birthday

Part C Referral Date is 150 days before 3rd birthday

If TPC is within 150 days before 3rd birthday

- 3. Additional group members for determining a specific learning disability (SLD)





EVALUATION 3301-51-11 (G)(2)

For Reevaluations, the IEP team is the qualified team and includes:

- 1. Parent
- 2. General education teacher
- 3. Special education provider
- 4. At least two representatives of the school district who collectively meet specific requirements
- 5. Other individuals who have knowledge or special expertise






PRESCHOOL AGE ELIGIBILITY 3301-51-11 (G)(4)

- Must be at least 3 and not 6
- Exceptions:
 - Younger than 3
 - If age eligible for Kindergarten, but not compulsory school age under the following conditions:
 - Consideration for school-age services
 - As of April 6, 2023,
 - No longer required to conduct reevaluation prior to age 6 for children under the category of Developmental Delay


