PRESCHOOL AND SCHOOL AGE CHILDCARE LICENSING VIOLATIONS

FY16



This report provides a summary of the details related to violations of Preschool and School Age Child Care licensing rules as noted by licensing personnel conducting onsite visits during the 2015-16 school year. Violations must be corrected. The first step in correction is the creation and implementation of a written corrective-action plan.
