In March of this year, Ashland High School senior Kayla Selan had the chance to conduct the Ashland Symphony Orchestra's Family Concert. It was only a few months prior, in December 2022, that she had expressed interest in conducting after becoming enamored with the conductor at a concert featuring trumpeter Rodney Marsalis.

As they walked out of the concert, Selan told her teacher Marty Kral—director of bands and music chair at Ashland—of her interest. It was Kral who helped connect her with the Ashland Symphony, which then sparked conversations and conducting lessons with Michael Repper, who was recently appointed as the ensemble's new director.

CAN is a multi-year grant initiative to create nationwide virtual Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) with educators in visual/media arts, music, theater and dance. The purpose of CAN is to build a sustainable model of professional learning for arts educators in public schools and public charters to strengthen their pedagogy, instruction and leadership skills in order to better serve students. CAN is recruiting up to 600 arts educators (150 per art form) to serve as PLC participants. PLCs will meet virtually every month from Jan. 2024-June 2026.

The Ohio Arts Council invites teachers, librarians, and administrators to register their high school or arts center for 2023-2024 participation in this national program. Created by the National Endowment for the Arts and the Poetry Foundation, Poetry Out Loud encourages students to learn about great poetry through memorization and recitation, helping students master public speaking skills, build self-confidence, and learn about literary heritage and contemporary life. Poetry Out Loud is aligned with Common Core and National Council of Teachers of English (NCTE) standards. Contests, workshops, and multi-media program materials, including curricula, are free. Poetry Out Loud starts at the classroom/school or at the local level with an area organization. Students memorize and recite poems they select from an anthology of more than 1,200 classic and contemporary poems. Winners then may advance to a regional and/or state competition, and ultimately to the National Finals. Since the program began in 2005, more than 4.3 million students and 76,000 teachers from 19,000 schools and organizations across the nation have participated in Poetry Out Loud. Registration to participate in the 2024 recitation competition is open to high schools, arts centers, and homeschool/online schools.




