Educators: The Buffett Early Childhood Institute united home-based, center-based, and school-based early educators at 26 screenings & discussions across Nebraska. Their feedback on workforce compensation, professional development, and the needs of young children and families will be presented to the full Nebraska Early Childhood Workforce Commission, which is charged with releasing an action plan in early 2020.

Advocates: "We screened this film 8 times across Vermont to educate legislators and mobilize Vermonters to call for increased investment in access to affordable, high-quality child core. This led the state legislature to invest a historic \$7.4 million in affordable child care and early educator recruitment.'

Legislators: After the Alabama House Ways and Means Education Committee screened the film in their statehouse, they went on to pass the largest education budget in the history of the state: \$7.1 billion. This budget will fund a 4% pay increase for every education employee in the state, 164 new pre-k classrooms, and much more.
