2023 Professional Learning Survey

High School Financial Literacy Licensure Validation Update

The State Board of Education approved the <u>draft of the OAC 3301-24-30 Educator License Validation in Financial Literacy Instruction</u> on April 11. The Department will next file this rule with the Joint Commission for Agency Rule Review for final adoption into the Ohio Administrative Code. The Department is currently developing a financial literacy Ohio Assessment for Educators, as required by the rule, and will begin accepting applications for this new validation as soon as the State Board of Education has adopted the examination.

2023 Ohio Teacher Leadership Summit

The 2023 Ohio Teacher Leadership Summit will be held on June 14 from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Ohio Union on the campus of The Ohio State University. The summit brings together educators from schools, districts and organizations doing innovative work to develop teacher leaders. Summit attendees will share successes, lessons learned and strategies for overcoming challenges around teacher leadership implementation.

Participants will share their knowledge, create networks and connections and participate in professional learning. The summit offers an opportunity to become engaged in a statewide network of teacher leaders and administrators to promote and strengthen teacher leadership. Ohio's Teacher Leadership Summit aligns with current and future education topics related to Future Forward Ohio.

Grant Opportunity: Library of Congress' Lewis-Houghton Civics and Democracy Initiative

Congress established the Lewis-Houghton Civics and Democracy Initiative and appropriated funds to the Library of Congress "to develop and administer a pilot educational program as a part of the Initiative, which funds eligible organizations within the United States and its territories to develop digitally-enabled comprehensive, assessable teaching project-based creative arts-driven curricula programs focused on using the digitized primary sources of the Library of Congress related to history, civics and democracy."

Awards made under Lewis-Houghton Civics and Democracy Initiative must include rights-free materials from the Library's vast collections of music and creative arts-related resources to develop curriculum, teaching materials, and tools for history, civic and democracy instruction targeted toward high school students.
