# **United States Senate Youth Program Application Deadline October 17**

The <u>United States Senate Youth Program</u> is a unique educational experience for outstanding high school seniors interested in pursuing careers in public service. Two student leaders from each state will have the opportunity to spend a week in Washington, D.C., experiencing their national government in action during the annual program in March. Student delegates hear major policy addresses by Senators, cabinet members, officials from the Departments of State and Defense and directors of other federal agencies and participate in a meeting with a Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court. Students selected to represent Ohio in the national program also receive a \$10,000 scholarship. The application deadline is October 17.

## Release of Spring 2022 Ohio State Social Studies Test Items

Released items from the Spring 2022 administration of Ohio's State Tests are now available in Ohio's State Tests portal. The items give educators insight into the kinds of questions students experience and are a helpful tool to inform classroom instruction and assessment. Both teachers and parents can use the items to help students know what to expect.

This release contains the associated learning standards and scoring guides. The scoring guides include answer keys, scoring rubrics, sample student responses, and notes on scoring and rationales that describe why response options are correct or incorrect.

### **Supreme Court of Ohio Field Trip Transportation Grants**

The Supreme Court of Ohio is providing school transportation grants to help defray the cost of a visit to the Supreme Court and its Visitor Education Center during the 2022-2023 school year.

The online application window will be open from September 12 - 25, 2022. All Ohio schools receiving state funds are welcome to apply for a grant ranging from \$220 to \$440, based on the distance from the school to the Thomas J. Moyer Ohio Judicial Center. Schools are eligible to receive one grant for students in 4th grade and above.

Grants are awarded based on the percentage of students enrolled in the free and reduced lunch program, as reported by the Ohio Department of Education. The Supreme Court of Ohio will reimburse schools after the field trip.

Educators and students can visit the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland's Money Museum without leaving the classroom. Their virtual field trips can complement the classroom course curriculum and provide students with a fun experience while they learn about important topics. Field trip activities include learning opportunities about currency recognition, earning, budgeting, financial decision making, investing, inflation, credit score, history of central banking in the United States and more.
