

Diabetes Care in Ohio Schools Annual Report of Survey Results

Reporting Period: 2016-17 School Year

Ohio school districts and chartered nonpublic schools are required to annually report diabetes care information to the Ohio Department of Education. The diabetes care information includes: the number of students with diabetes enrolled in the districts or schools during the previous school year; and the number of errors associated with the administration of diabetes medication to students during the same time period.

To assist districts and schools in reporting this information, the Department conducts a statewide survey. For the 2016-17 school year, the results are as follows:

Of the 956 responding Ohio districts and schools, there was a reported total of 5183 students with diabetes enrolled in the 2016-17 school year. Out of the 956 responses, 766 reported no errors associated with the administration of diabetes medication.

The Department notifies school districts and schools that they must complete and submit the survey by the end of each calendar year. An annual report will be issued for the prior school year and posted to the Department's website.
