## Diabetes Care in Ohio Schools Annual Report of Survey Results

## Reporting Period: 2017-2018 School Year

Ohio school districts and chartered nonpublic schools are required to annually report diabetes care information to the Ohio Department of Education. The diabetes care information includes: the number of students with diabetes enrolled in the districts or schools during the previous school year; and the number of errors associated with the administration of diabetes medication to students during the same time period.

To assist districts and schools in reporting this information, the Department conducts a statewide survey. The Department notifies school districts and schools that they must complete and submit the survey by the end of each calendar year. The results for the 2017-2018 school year are available in the table below.

Of the 1256 responding Ohio districts and schools, there was a reported total of 6868 students with diabetes enrolled in the 2017-2018 school year. Out of the 1256 responses, 1032 reported no errors associated with the administration of diabetes medication.
