- 2 On days when school is not in session; weekends, holidays, vacation, or summer break, participants are eligible to receive Lunch. Participant may receive up to 2 meals and one snack or 2 snacks and one meal per day.
- The following qualifications must be met for Youth Development Sponsors wishing to serve participants ages 13 18. a. The site must qualify as an After School At Risk site. b. The site must be in an area served by a school where 50% or more of the children qualify for free and reduced priced school lunch meals.
- 4 At Risk programs contain no provision for claiming participants aged 13 18 in areas not qualified by 50% free and reduced priced children.
- Meal and/or snack be provided to children in the CACFP After School At Risk and School Operated After School Care Snack Programs through the age of 18. These programs can continue to claim reimbursement for a meal and / or snack served to children who turn age 19 during the regular school year.
- 6 Sites located in areas served by a school in which at least 50 percent of the enrolled children are certified eligible for free and reduced price meals are eligible to receive reimbursement at the free rate for snacks served to all children eligible for snacks, regardless of each individual child's eligibility for free or reduced price lunches and breakfasts.
- 7 Sites which are not in areas served by a school in which at least 50 percent of the enrolled children are certified eligible for free and reduced price meals must count meals and claim reimbursement by type (free, reduced price and paid), and must have documentation of eligibility for all meals served free or at a reduced price. (Under no circumstances may a school charge children for snacks claimed at the free reimbursement rate.) Charges for reduced price snacks may not exceed 15 cents, as stipulated in program regulations at 7 CFR section 210.9 (c)(4).
- 8 After School At Risk programs only eligible to claim one meal and one snack per day per child.
