Fuji apples were developed in 1962 at the Tohoku Research Station in Morioka, Japan. They have quickly become one of the most commonly grown apple varieties in Japan and in the 1980's were made commercially available in the United States. Today, the bulk of Fuji apples are grown in Japan, China and apple growing regions in the United States such as California and Washington State.

Fuji apples are a hybrid of two American varieties, the Red Delicious and Virginia Ralls Janet. They are named after Japan's most sacred mountain, Mount Fuji. Fuji apples are great raw or are also a good baking apple.
