

**OHIO SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM  
PUBLIC RELEASE  
FOR ENROLLED SITES AND RESIDENTIAL/NON-RESIDENTIAL CAMPS**

(Participants qualify by Income Eligibility Application)

**RELEASE B** (For non-pricing camps and enrolled sites that are not located in economically depressed areas) This announcement must be made available to all participants in your program. You may meet this requirement by making the announcement a part of your program application or including it with the family size/income form used to document family size/income or Food Stamp/OWF eligibility. Children that qualify for food stamp/OWF are automatically eligible for free meals.

Please state when this information will be distributed to your program participants. If a separate charge will be made for meals served to non-needy children (pricing program) enrolled in a camp, please inform the State Agency immediately. Although the procedures relating to pricing programs are quite complex, the regulations do allow for the operation of pricing programs.

The \_\_\_\_\_ (Sponsor of Name) announces the sponsorship of the Summer Food Service Program for Children. Free meals will be made available to eligible children 18 years of age and under or persons over 18 who are determined by a state or local public educational agency to be mentally or physically disabled. Children who are members of food stamp households or OWF assistance units are automatically eligible for free meals. To be eligible, children participating in residential camps must meet the income guidelines for reduced meals in the National School Lunch Program.
