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Executive Summary

This report covers four quarters (1 Oct 2022 – 30 Sep 2023) of the Ohio Troops to Teachers (TTT) Program.

During this period the Ohio TTT Program Coordinator:

- 1. Generated 1,390 contacts and leads resulting in 622 emails and numerous phone conversations.
 - a. Presented at the Transition Assistance Program (TAP) at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base resulting in 671 contacts.
 - b. Received 491 contacts from the national Program Interest (PI) reports.
- 2. Held two virtual meetings with the Ohio Troops to Teachers Advisory Council providing programmatic updates and soliciting their expertise.
- 3. Met with, attended or made presentations to events around Ohio.
 - a. Academic Excellence for All Conference (14 Oct 2022)
 - b. Dublin Scioto High School Military Appreciation Night (10 Nov 22)
 - c. Hyatt's Middle School Veterans Day Living History event (4 Nov 22)
 - d. Hamilton Township Military Appreciation Night (17 Jan 23)
 - e. Ohio Educator Standards Board (10 Mar 23)
 - f. Ohio Veterans Education Council (15 Mar 23)
 - g. Ohio Jobs and Family Services Military Appreciation Month Training (23 May 23)
 - h. Toledo Public Schools (1 Aug 2023)
- 4. Produced a joint (Ohio Department of Education and Ohio Department of Veterans Services) Veterans Day message with leaders of both agencies.
- 5. Served on the <u>Ohio's Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission (MIC3)</u> state council.
- 6. Between February 2023 and this reporting date, issued 46 vouchers to cover the cost of the Ohio Assessments for Educators required for our participants. During this period, 39 vouchers have been redeemed by participants.



Introduction

This report serves as both an annual and close-out report for the Ohio TTT Program.

Due to the Department of Defense's Defense-Wide Review, resources from the national TTT Program were reallocated to higher priority programs resulting in the national TTT program ceasing financial benefits on 1 Oct 2020. The State of Ohio accepted a no-cost extension that extended the expiration date to 14 July 2022 or sooner if the residual funds are expended. Due to the passage of the National Defense Authorization Act FY22 on 27 Dec 2021 the National TTT Program was reauthorized, and additional funding (\$175K) was allocated to Ohio through an Unfunded Requirement (UFR). The reauthorization and funding enabled the program to remain active until 15 May 2023. The State of Ohio accepted a second no-cost extension that enables the program to remain active until 15 May 2024.

The Ohio TTT Program Coordinator serves on the <u>Ohio's Military Interstate Children's Compact</u> <u>Commission (MIC3)</u> state council since the program coordinator works closely with the Purple Star Program and the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce.

The number of military service members, veterans and active-duty service member spouses applying for educator credentials has increased over the last two years following several years of decline:




Figure 1. Ohio Military Fee Waiver Usage, 2018-2023

Achievement of Milestones by Program Goal

The six specific goals in the Troops to Teachers grant announcement:

- 1. Attract and increase the number of eligible current and former members of the armed forces participating in the TTT Program.
- 2. Reduce barriers that prevent veterans from meeting teacher certifications requirements for transitioning into teaching careers.
- 3. Implement educational models to award academic credit for prior career experience and/or other relevant military training.
- 4. Provide individualized counseling to assist TTT participants with meeting the educational and certification requirements to transition into a teaching career.
- 5. Support state and local education agencies with hiring motivated, experienced, and dedicated eligible members and former members of the armed forces; thereby, increasing the number of veterans employed as teachers.
- 6. Address geographic areas with critical teacher shortages, especially in high-need schools (as defined in subsection (a) of such section 1154), in particular the shortage of science, mathematics, special education, foreign language, or career or technical teachers, and in elementary schools or secondary schools, or as career or technical teachers.

² The Ohio Department of Higher Education reports the number of students enrolled in and completing teacher preparation programs who are serving or have served in the military. This is aggregate data, and we are unable to further determine how many of these individuals are participants of the program.

³ This is the first year we have been able to access data on our program participants who are reported as working in Ohio schools. These values represent the number of Troops to Teachers participants we worked with this grant year who have assignment data reported to the state of Ohio. This does not include participants who we have worked with in previous years who are just now being hired and does not include participants we have worked with who are teaching but are not reported to the state of Ohio (some schools do not report all assignments to the state).

Future Initiatives

The Ohio Department of Education's Office of Educator Effectiveness will continue to support transitioning active-duty, currently serving reserve-component service members, and military veterans navigate the path to becoming an educator in Ohio.

The Department only began issuing vouchers for Ohio Assessments for Educators (OAEs) in February 2023 and still found that word of the opportunity spread quickly. The vouchers were not only a benefit for our current program participants, but also helped attract other military veterans who were applying for a teaching license but were unaware of the program. This allowed program staff to connect new participants with other resources offered by the program that participants were not previously aware of. The program expects to increase the rate that they issue these vouchers as word of their existence continues to spread.

Since Ohio TTT Program Coordinator David Schklar retired on 1 Mar 2023, the Ohio Department of Education has been seeking a replacement for his position. The Department has conducted several interviews and hopes to make an offer soon. In the meantime, Eric Petro has been serving as interim state coordinator.
