Executive Summary

This report covers Grant Year 4 (1 Oct 2021 – 30 Sep 2022) of the Ohio Troops to Teachers (TTT) Program. The State of Ohio accepted the no-cost extension that extended the expiration date to 15 May 2023.

Due to the passage of the National Defense Authorization Act FY22 on 27 Dec 2021 the National TTT Program was reauthorized, and additional funding (\$175K) was allocated to Ohio through an Unfunded Requirement (UFR).

During this grant year the Ohio TTT Program Coordinator:

- 1. Generated 1,368 contacts and leads resulting in 321 emails and numerous phone conversations.
 - a. Presented at the Transition Assistance Program at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base (WPAFB) resulting in 742 contacts.
 - b. Participated in the Columbus Career Fair hosted by Recruit Military. (10 Nov 21)
 - c. Received 512 contacts from the national Program Interest (PI) reports.
 - d. Communicated with 103 individuals documented using Ohio's contact log.
- 2. Supervised 3 Area Coordinators increasing the TTT Program outreach.
- 3. Held two virtual meetings with the Ohio Troops to Teachers Advisory Council providing programmatic updates and soliciting their expertise. See Section 5 of this report for a list of membership. (4 Oct 21 & 24 Mar 22)
- 4. Attended or made presentations at various events around Ohio.
 - a. Virtual presentation hosted by the Educational Service Center of Central Ohio (ESCCO) on military careers to the middle schools in the Columbus City School District. (18 Nov 21)
 - b. Ohio Department of Education Avenue of Answers during the SY21/22 Capital Conference hosted by the Ohio School Board Association. (8-9 Nov 21)

The Ohio Department of Education will continue to support transitioning active-duty service members, reserve component service members and military veterans interested in a subsequent career in education.



Introduction

This report is the annual report (1 Oct 2021 – 30 Sep 2022) for the Ohio Troops to Teachers Program. Due to the Department of Defense's Defense-Wide Review, resources from the National TTT Program were reallocated to other higher priority program resulting in the national TTT program ceasing taking applications and ending financial benefits on 1 Oct 2020. The State of Ohio accepted the no-cost extension that extended the expiration date to 14 July 2022 or sooner if the residual funds are expended. Due to the passage of the National Defense Authorization Act FY22 on 27 Dec 2021 the National TTT Program was reauthorized, and additional funding (\$175K) was allocated to Ohio through an Unfunded Requirement (UFR). The reauthorization and funding enable the program to remain active until 15 May 2023.

Due to Ohio's response to COVID-19 face-to-face meetings and large gatherings were curtailed. The Ohio TTT Program Coordinator continued to present the TTT program at the virtual Wright-Patterson AFB (WPAFB) Transition Assistance Program (TAP) workshops. The WPAFB TAP did pilot an alternating schedule where the first TAP workshop of the month was in-person, and the second TAP workshop was virtual.

The Ohio TTT Program Coordinator held two virtual meetings with the Ohio Troops to Teachers Advisory Council providing programmatic updates and soliciting their expertise.

With the planned sunsetting of the national TTT Program, the Ohio Department of Education developed a separate program: Ohio Military Veteran Educators Program (OhioMVEP). OhioMVEP uses the TTT program as a model but expands its scope. Both programs currently exist separately in Ohio to support our military connected population.

To further the program's outreach Ohio's TTT Program Coordinator hired three Area Coordinators that were responsible for the Northeast, Northwest, and Central regions of the state.

The Ohio TTT Program Coordinator serves on the Ohio's Military Interstate Children's Compact Commission (MIC3) state council since the program coordinator works closely with the Purple Star Program and the Ohio Department of Education.

The number of individuals and credentials issued with the Military Fee Waiver has decreased over 3 years. We were not able to acquire the numbers for this reporting period 1 Oct 21 – 30 Sep 22.

- 1. 1 Jul 2018 30 June 2019: 2908 individuals 3,527 credentials
- 2. 1 Jul 2019 30 June 2020: 2609 individuals 3,170 credentials
- 3. 1 Jul 2020 30 June 2021: 2240 individuals 2.667 credentials
- 4. 1 Oct 2021 30 Sep 2022: unavailable for this report. We regret this omission and will seek to remedy in future reporting.

Note: Ohio uses a fiscal year of 1 July – 30 June.



Achievements of Milestones by Program Goal

GOALS

The six specific goals in the Troops to Teachers grant announcement:

- 1. Attract and increase the number of eligible current and former members of the armed forces participating in the TTT Program.
- 2. Reduce barriers that prevent veterans from meeting teacher certifications requirements for transitioning into teaching careers.
- 3. Implement educational models to award academic credit for prior career experience and/or other relevant military training.
- 4. Provide individualized counseling to assist TTT participants with meeting the educational and certification requirements to transition into a teaching career.
- 5. Support state and local education agencies with hiring motivated, experienced, and dedicated eligible members and former members of the armed forces; thereby, increasing the number of veterans employed as teachers.
- 6. Address geographic areas with critical teacher shortages, especially in high-need schools (as defined in subsection (a) of such section 1154), in particular the shortage of science, mathematics, special education, foreign language, or career or technical teachers, and in elementary schools or secondary schools, or as career or technical teachers.

FUTURE INITIATIVES

The Ohio Department of Education's Office of Educator Effectiveness will continue to support transitioning active-duty, currently serving reserve-component service members, and military veterans navigate the path to become an educator in Ohio. We are in the process of complimenting the national Troops to Teachers program with a state program titled Ohio Military Veteran Educators Program (OhioMVEP).

The Ohio TTT Program Coordinator will continue to meet with Higher Education faculty and college administrators to promote the TTT Program and to expand the Alternative Resident Educator Institute programs offered by these colleges to make them more accessible for military veterans to attend. Additional meetings are planned as Ohio has over 50 colleges that offer teacher preparation programs.

The Ohio TTT Program will release a joint 2022 Veterans Day announcement by the Director, Ohio Department of Veterans Services, MG (Ret) Deborah Ashenhurst and Interim Superintendent Dr. Stephanie Siddens promoting two new initiatives assisting transitioning active duty and currently serving reserve component service members, and their spouses:

- 1. Waiving the fees for the Alternative Resident Educator Evaluation Application
- 2. Providing vouchers to cover the fees to take the Ohio Assessment(s) for Educators.

Due to time restraints placed on the WPAFB TAP, the Ohio TTT Program Coordinator will cease making presentations to the workshop. However, with the workshop returning to an in-person format the coordinator will provide information cards to attendees and will set up a table to answer questions.

Due to the pending retirement of the Ohio TTT Program Coordinator, David Schklar, on 1 Mar 2023, the Ohio Department of Education has posted a <u>position description and job announcement</u> for his replacement.


