The goal of remote learning is to ensure learning continues even though school buildings are closed. Remote learning engages students through a variety of learning opportunities, which can be delivered online and/or offline. Remote learning does not just mean online learning. Technology certainly is a supportive tool for remote learning, but powerful remote learning can occur through thoughtful offline lessons that encourage students to explore the natural world and engage in interdisciplinary and artistic hands-on learning.

HB 164 (June 2020) indicates that “Each qualifying public school governing body may adopt a plan to provide instruction using a remote learning model for the 2020-2021 school year...Not later than August 21, 2020, the qualifying public school shall submit the adopted plan to the Department of Education. An adopted plan shall not be subject to approval by the Department. Each plan shall include all of the following: (1) A description of how student instructional needs will be determined and documented; (2) The method to be used for determining competency, granting credit, and promoting students to a higher grade level; (3) The school's attendance requirements, including how the school will document participation in learning opportunities; (4) A statement describing how student progress will be monitored; (5) A description as to how equitable access to quality instruction will be ensured; (6) A description of the professional development activities that will be offered to teachers...The Department shall make each plan it receives under division (B) of Section 16 publicly available on its website.”

Austintown Local School District has outlined our remote learning plan for students who are working from home during this pandemic. We have also extended our original e-learning program from prior years to accommodate student learning.

Address Promoting Students to a Higher Grade Level Here: Austintown Local School District will follow the Ohio Department of Education and Ohio Revised Code guidelines for promotion. For example, third grade students will be promoted to fourth grade either by earning a promotion score of 683 on the Ohio's State Test for grade 3 English language arts or if the student's principal and reading teacher agree that other evaluations of the student's skills in reading demonstrate the student is academically prepared to be promoted to the fourth grade. Remote learning students will be promoted the same as their face-to-face peers (following the Board Policy regarding promotion).

Attendance Requirements

Participation

How will your school district document student participation in remote learning?

Austintown Local School District will provide a variety of instruction models, including both teacher-led remote learning and self-directed remote learning.

Student attendance in teacher-led remote learning (asynchronous web-based instruction) shall be tracked in the same manner as hourly, in-person instruction. Teachers shall determine hourly attendance by evidence of student login and logoff data. Teachers are encouraged to verify meaningful attendance in a method selected by the teacher, such as an ungraded quiz at the close of a lesson, a survey or answer questions (unrelated to the lesson and unpredictable); the end of the lesson, or asking students questions at random throughout a session.

In addition to the approved reasons for excused absences listed in the Austintown Local School District Board Policy, absences from teacher-led remote learning (synchronous web-based instruction) may be considered excused under the following circumstances, with written or phone notice from a Parent/guardian:

1. Temporary internet outage for individual students or households
2. Unexpected technical difficulties for individual students or households, such as password resets or software upgrades occurring during a teacher-led remote learning lesson
3. Computer device malfunction

4. Malfunction of a District-owned device for which the District is providing technical assistance, repair, or replacement.

Attendance in self-directed remote learning (asynchronous) shall be tracked by evidence of participation, which may include, but is not limited to:

1. Daily logins to learning management systems
2. Daily interactions with the teacher to acknowledge attendance, which may include, but are not limited to messages, emails, telephone calls, video chats or other formats that enable teachers to engage with students
3. Assignment completion

The teacher will determine the number of hours a typical student would take to complete an assignment and report those hours of attendance when the assignment is completed. A teacher should adjust the number of hours of attendance based on the length of time the student actually spent on the assignment reported by the student, parent, or other person with knowledge (if a teacher knows that a regular education student or special education student took "significantly" longer" the student should be given additional attendance "credit.") The administration will need to determine how it intends to verify the amount of time the student or parent reports it took the child to complete the assignment from the time a "typical" student would be expected to take to complete the assignment.
