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20-21 Remote Learning Plan

Description of how student instructional needs will be determined and documented.

Remote learning students will have a licensed teacher assigned to deliver and assess instruction based on state standards. As with direct classroom instruction, parent input, Individual Education Plans and student individual needs will determine instructional and assessment practices.

The method to be used for determining competency, granting credit and promoting students to higher grade levels.

Competency will be assessed by adhering to Centerburg School District Policies on assessments and promotion regardless if the student is attending in class instruction or remote learning. Attainment of required levels of achievement of the Ohio Standards will determine course credit and promotion.

How the school will document participation in learning opportunities.

In class learning will be monitored and reported following Centerburg Attendance Policies. Remote student attendance will be monitored and reported by either having direct contact with the teacher through video conferencing or through email or completing an assignment that covered that day's instruction. ALL students, regardless of type of learning will be required to meet attendance requirements as set forth by the Centerburg School District Board of Education and/or the State of Ohio School Attendance Regulations.

Monitoring of Student Progress

Student progress will be monitored by the use of assignments, assessments and/or engagement. Assessments may be vendor assessments, teacher generated assessments and/or oral evaluations. All Individual Education Plan requirements will be followed as far as assessment modifications. Student's progress will be monitored through teacher recorded assignments in POWERSCHOOL. Staff will monitor a student's progress and intervene if the progress is not sufficient for the individual student's abilities.

How will equitable access to quality instruction be assured.

If requested, remote students will be issued a Chromebook to use at home. If a student does not have adequate, or no internet access in their home, the district will supply a hotspot through Verizon, at district expense. This hotspot will only be accessible using a district issued Chromebook so that CIPA filtering requirements are maintained. Intervention Specialists will work with assigned students to assure that the Individual Education Plan modifications and requirement are followed. In class students will be monitored as usual and ensure that they received high quality instruction.

Professional development activities provided to teachers.

Centerburg has been a Google Certified School since 2011. Centerburg staff have received continual training on use of the Google Suite applications. The Google Suite has a myriad of applications that meet all online needs for instruction. All Centerburg students' in grades K-12 have a Google account that allows them access to Centerburg Google applications without having access to "outside" applications. Students in grades K-5 can email any other Centerburg domain email but cannot send or receive email outside the domain. This assures student safety and security while online. Technology teachers have been given a stipend to be available to present large group and individual instruction/help to any staff requesting help. This help will be continuous through the school year and can be requested at any time. Staff will receive COVID information and training from Knox County Public Health to assure they understand and can apply all COVID safety protocol.
