Description of how student instructional needs will be determined and documented.

Graham's Remote Learning Plan will provide online, self-guided instruction for students in grades K – 12. Students in grades K – 5 will access Schools PLP online platform and students in grades 6 – 12 will utilize APEX online platform. Graham teachers will provide facilitation, guidance and assistance for students by monitoring work, grading work as needed and providing instruction. Progress will be documented by student's completion of assignments, assessments and other graded work. Final grades will be issued at the end of each grading period.

Method for determining competence, granting credit, and promoting students.

Graham Local Schools will continue to utilize the existing grading procedures, scales and assessments as is used in previous years. Students will be expected to complete online learning lessons in the required time period, or they will receive incomplete/failing grade. The grading scales will remain same for online learning, as with in-person learning.

The administration will work with teachers to develop additional guidelines as needed for grading and assessment in remote learning opportunities. The administration and teachers will continue to work together to determine credit earned and promotion for all students.

Attendance Requirements.

Students attending through the online option will be monitored by the assigned Graham Local teacher. The expectation is that students will be present online during teacher led discussions/instruction, complete work to show daily progress, and show "attendance" through daily engagement on the learning platform.

Monitoring of Students.

Students will be monitored daily by their assigned online instructor. Progress toward completion of work is available through the online platform and can generate reports for parents/students.

How equitable access to quality instruction will be ensured.

Students will have access to school-issued computer and internet access, in it is not currently available. Accommodations will be made when necessary to meet individual student needs. *(NOTE: Paper copies will be made available for any student that may choose this method as a part of the remote learning opportunity.)* Online platforms are aligned with state standards and will be aligned with course pacing guides for Graham Local.

Professional Development opportunities for teachers.

Teachers will have the opportunity for training related to their respective platform, Schools PLP or APEX. These trainings will occur prior to the start of the school year and will include best practice online resources, utilizing technology and providing additional supports for students.
