

# **Logan Elm Local Schools 2020-2021 Remote Learning Plan**

## **Description of how student instructional needs will be determined and documented:**

Using quality assessment data throughout the year, teachers will collaborate to design instruction for our students. Instructional plans will be based on state standards and the academic and social emotional needs of individual students.

## **The method to be used for determining competency, granting credit, and promoting students to higher grade levels:**

Student academic competency will be monitored using state testing, third party vendor assessments, and teacher assessments. Credits and promotions will be granted accordingly.

## **The school's attendance requirements, including how the school will document participation in learning opportunities:**

Logan Elm will ensure compliance with legal minimum hours, instructional calendars, and attendance requirements, while providing and monitoring meaningful learning to grow each student.

- *Hybrid (50% In-School, 50% Remote Learning)* - Attendance will be taken on the days the student is scheduled to be physically present. For days the students will be remote learning, teachers will track attendance using various evidence of participation methods. This may include logins and time spent on digital programs, communication with teachers, and evidence of work completed.
- *Remote Learning (100%)* - Teachers will track attendance using various evidence of participation methods. This may include logins and time spent on digital programs, communication with teachers, participation in virtual meetings, and evidence of work completed.

## **Description of how students' progress will be monitored:**

Student growth will be monitored using third party vendor and teacher assessments in order to inform instruction and determine student mastery. Progress data will be monitored at the classroom, building, and district level.

## **Description as to how equitable access to quality instruction will be ensured:**

In 2020-21 our district will be one-to-one, with each K-12 student receiving a district owned Chromebook. They will take the device home daily, allowing for online and offline work. Internet access is a challenge. We will work with individual families as needed to problem solve, provide opportunities for downloading materials while at school, and provide paper materials when necessary. In a fully remote model, teachers will use asynchronous learning as much as possible. Students who are not engaging will be referred to the building administration, school counselor, and/or district social worker as appropriate in order to determine the source of the problem and find individual solutions.

## **Description of the professional development activities offered to teachers:**

We transitioned two scheduled days of district professional development to virtual, asynchronous learning over the summer which focused on preparing for hybrid and remote learning. Teachers had a combination of required sessions, offered sessions, and the ability to have individualized training needs approved. Each building will have an additional day of in person collaboration before starting the year. Monthly staff meetings and early release time will be used for additional learning opportunities as needed. A technology integration coach will be working in our district one day a week to provide small group and individual training and we have contracted to offer online technology integration professional development the entire school year.

# Logan Elm Schools Reopening Plan

- Underlying the principles for Logan Elm Local Schools’ re-opening plan is the knowledge that each building’s plan may be slightly different due to size of building, student population and allocated space.
- All plans are subject to change based on recommendations from the health departments and community and district COVID -19 cases.
  - **Plan A:** All Students Attend Every Day with Safety Precautions
  - **Plan B:** Blended/Hybrid—Alternating Days of Attendance
  - **Plan C:** Remote Learning
  - **eLearning Option:** Parents may choose to enroll their student in eLearning or “online only” courses for the 2020-2021 school year.
- Each option has associated risks with regards to COVID-19 exposure and academic/social emotional impact.
- The plans were developed in accordance with recommendations from the State and Local Health Departments, American Academy of Pediatrics and the Ohio Department of Education.
- The Superintendent will consider the County Alert Level for Pickaway and Hocking Counties in determining which plan is in effect at any given time. While some open enrollment students may reside in other counties, the majority of Logan Elm students reside in Pickaway County and Hocking County.
- The District may switch from one plan to another throughout the year, depending on the alert levels for Pickaway and Hocking Counties. If a change should occur, the District will use the website (loganelm.org), the automated call system and Twitter (@loganelmschools) to notify students and families, if a change in plan will be implemented.

## Plan A: All Students at School Every Day

- This plan is implemented when County Health Level is 1 (Yellow) or 2 (Orange).*
- Students return to school with social distancing, advanced cleaning and increased safety measures.*
- ❖ **Social Distancing at 3'**
  - More balanced class sizes with elimination of new open enrollment to ensure 3' social distancing
  - Students have their own Chromebooks (1:1)
  - Cleaning protocols to comply with Federal, State and Local recommendations.
  - Increased hand sanitizing stations
  - Touchless faucets and paper towel dispensers are in the process of being installed
  - Parents assess student health before school, including temperature checks
  - Recommended limit of two students per seat on buses; students from same household may sit 3 per seat.
  - Breakfast will be served “Grab and Go” style
  - Lunch will be pre-packed and/or served in “to go” containers
    - Students will be seated in a larger area to allow for social distancing
    - In order to decrease the handling of money, online payments are recommended. If online payments cannot be made, weekly payments are encouraged.
  - No visitors
  - No shared student supplies
  - Monitor and limit traffic in hallways
  - No field trips
  - No large group student events (i.e.—assemblies, pep rallies)
  - Masks must be worn by students in grades 3-12 in all areas where people cannot social distance (bus, hallways, classrooms not at 6' social distance).
  - Teachers/Staff required to wear masks.

### Risk Levels

Exposure to COVID-19: Highest

Academic/Social emotional impact: Lowest

All plans are subject to change based on recommendations from the health departments as well as number of community and district confirmed cases.



## Plan B: Blended/Hybrid Model

- ❖ *Students attend school in “alternating day” groups to reduce number of students in classrooms.*
- This plan is implemented when County Health Level is 3 (Red).*
- ❖ **Social Distancing at 6’**
  - 50% of students in session at one time to allow for 6’ social distancing
    - *Students divided based on last name of household: A-J in one group; K-Z in another group.*
    - *Calendar included on the next page indicates days of attendance at school*
    - *Expectations for “home instruction days” will be set by building administrators*
  - Parents assess student health before school, including temperature checks
  - Cleaning protocols to comply with Federal, State and Local recommendations.
  - Physical distancing guidelines followed with 6’ separation
  - Recommended limit of one student per seat on buses; students from same household may sit 2 or 3 per seat.
  - Breakfast will be served “Grab and Go” style
  - Lunch will be pre-packed and/or served in “to go” containers
    - Students will be seated in a larger area, which may include cafeteria and other spaces including classrooms, to allow for social distancing
    - In order to decrease the handling of money, online payments are recommended. If online payments cannot be made, weekly payments are encouraged.
  - No visitors or volunteers
  - Students in grades 3-12 are required to wear mask at all times.
  - All safety precautions listed in Plan A will be in place.

### Risk Levels

Exposure to COVID-19: Moderate

Academic/Social emotional impact: Moderate

All plans are subject to change based on recommendations from the health departments as well as number of community and district confirmed cases.

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## Plan C: Remote Learning

- All students will receive education remotely at home.
- This plan is implemented when County Health Level is 4 (Purple).
- Remote Learning
  - Teachers and administrators have used summer professional development time to prepare for remote learning.
  - Remote learning will remain as rigorous as traditional school, with expectations from staff and students to continue learning based on state standards.
  - Student attendance will be taken and recorded by teachers.
  - Students will receive traditional marks/grades from teachers.
  - Breakfast and lunch meals will be “pick up” only.
  - All extra-curricular activities associated with the school will be suspended/cancelled.

Academic/Social emotional impact: Highest

## eLearning Option for 2020-2021 School Year

*Students and Parents may choose to enroll in an “online only” option for the 2020-2021 school year.*

- Students in Grades K-6 will utilize a learning management system called Florida Virtual School (FLVS.net) and will be supported by Logan Elm staff.
- Students in Grades 7-12 will enroll in ACE Digital Academy.
- Parents and guardians of students who wish to enroll in eLearning option must contact the building administration/principal prior to August 3, 2020.
- In the event that an enrolled student does not have a device at home for online learning, they will be provided with a school issued Chromebook, regardless of grade level (K-12) upon turning in the necessary district technology and Chromebook agreements.
- Students will receive traditional grades in alignment with the grading scales and policies of the school in which they would otherwise be attending in person.
- All students enrolled in eLearning through Logan Elm Local Schools will be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities and athletics, if they meet the requirements established by OHSAA.

### Risk Levels

Exposure to COVID-19: Responsibility of risk is upon the parent/guardian.

Academic/Social emotional impact: Responsibility of risk is upon the parent/guardian.
