A description of the professional development activities that will be offered to teachers:

- ✓ Ongoing and targeted PD will be offered to teachers on our preferred software systems, as well as instructional strategies and best practices



Recommendations and Best Practices:

Fixed schedules: Courses have established schedules for teacher-led instruction

- ✓ Daily schedules will be consistent and provide multiple learning platform that include live lessons, small group and individual instruction

Online learning materials:

- ✓ Online materials are aligned to support teacher-led instruction and curriculum based off the SEL Pacing Guides and Ohio State Standards

Clear expectations:

- ✓ Teachers will establish clear expectations to guide students as they engage in non-classroom-based learning. Students may be offered flexibility on the pace of when the non-teacher-led instruction will occur, which could provide flexibility to students as they navigate the demands on their time when they are not in the classroom

School and Community Communication Plan:

- ✓ The district has clearly communicated its plans to students, parents and faculty in an effort to facilitate cohesion as the community transitions into the school year
- ✓ Our plan is visible on our District website and is continuously updated and communicated to our parents/guardians, students, community and stakeholders
