**A description of how student instructional needs will be determined and documented.**

Online learning materials are aligned to the curricula of the courses that had been designed for in-person teacher-led instruction. The learning model will include a common instruction framework for the district. The district is using a Learning Management System (Schoology) to align the communication, lesson delivery, assessment and learning options for students and families. Progress will be reported using multiple options within the LMS, formative and summative assessment data and other platforms being utilized for educational purposes.

**The method to be used for determining competency, granting credit and promoting students to higher grade levels.**

Traditional letter grade scales will continue to be utilized in grades 4-12. A standards-based reporting will be utilized in grades K-3. Credit will be granted for students who successfully complete the requirements of the course.

**The school's attendance requirements, including how the school will document participation in learning opportunities.**

Student participation in remote learning will be tracked and monitored using Schoology login data. Students will be required to login to Schoology on instructional days.

**A statement describing how student progress will be monitored.**

Student progress will be monitored using a combination of formative and summative assessment data. In addition, grades and completion will be tracked and monitored in Schoology for students in grades 4-12. Building principals, Building Leadership Teams, teachers and counselors will track and monitor students at-risk for not meeting course expectations and follow-up with students and families when additional support is needed.

**A description as to how equitable access to quality instruction will be ensured.**

The district has developed a plan to ensure supports are provided to families who are in need of technology and access to resources. The district currently provides a Chromebook to each student in grade 6-12. A plan has been developed to provide at least one device for each family in grades K-5. In addition mobile hotspots have been purchased for families who do

not have internet access. Access points have been placed in strategic locations throughout the district to ensure all students have access to learning materials.

The district is revising curriculum materials and delivery options to ensure the needs of students with disabilities are met.

**A description of the professional development activities that will be offered to teachers.**

The district developed a 5 week course for teachers focused on best practices for remote learning. This course included remote teaching tools for planning and instruction, assessment in a remote setting, self-guided learning and differentiation. In addition, the start of the school year has been delayed by 4 days in order to provide teachers with professional development focused on teaching in a remote setting.
