The goal of remote learning is to ensure learning continues even though school buildings are closed. Remote learning engages students through a variety of learning opportunities, which can be delivered online and/or offline. Remote learning does not just mean online learning. Technology certainly is a supportive tool for remote learning, but powerful remote learning can occur through thoughtful offline lessons that encourage students to explore the natural world and engage in interdisciplinary and artistic hands-on learning.

HB 164 (June 2020) indicates that *“Each qualifying public school governing body may adopt a plan to provide instruction using a remote learning model for the 2020-2021 school year. An adopted plan shall not be subject to approval by the Department. Each plan shall include all of the following: (1) A description of how student instructional needs will be determined and documented; (2) The method to be used for determining competency, granting credit, and promoting students to a higher grade level; (3) The school's attendance requirements, including how the school will document participation in learning opportunities; (4) A statement describing how student progress will be monitored; (5) A description as to how equitable access to quality instruction will be ensured; (6) A description of the professional development activities that will be offered to teachers...The Department shall make each plan it receives under division (B) of Section 16 publicly available on its website.”*

**The deadline for qualifying public schools to submit their adopted Remote Learning Plans to the Ohio Department of Education has been extended to **August 21, 2020** to allow school leaders sufficient time to develop their plans. Adopted Remote Learning Plans should be submitted electronically to [remotelarning@education.ohio.gov](mailto:remotelarning@education.ohio.gov).**

**NOTE: As the school year proceeds and circumstances evolve, school districts are able to amend their respective remote learning plans to address changing needs. District superintendents are able to make amendments to the remote learning plan on behalf of the school district without additional local school board approval. Amended plans, however, must be resubmitted to ODE by email at [remotelarning@education.ohio.gov](mailto:remotelarning@education.ohio.gov). The Department will make all plans publicly available at [www.education.ohio.gov](http://www.education.ohio.gov).**

### OVERVIEW OF REMOTE LEARNING IN UPPER ARLINGTON SCHOOLS

Throughout the summer, the Upper Arlington Schools team has worked to consider several different scenarios for how we would be starting the school year and the different learning models we may need as long as COVID-19 remains a concern. Families, students and staff members shared their thoughts through multiple surveys and focus groups--totalling more than 12,000 touchpoints in all. Their feedback informed the planning for the 2020-2021 school year and any future distance learning needs.

The result of all of this feedback and work is the [Upper Arlington Schools Responsible Restart Plan](#), which was approved by the Board of Education on July 31, 2020. This plan details two pathways for students for the 2020-2021 school year and numerous health and safety measures that will be implemented to deliver in-person learning. The **school-based pathway** offers two models that may be implemented at any time depending on the current situation with COVID-19: the [hybrid model](#), which combines in-person and remote learning, and the [Enhanced Distance Learning model](#).

The [UA Online Academy pathway](#) is a K-12 fully online learning alternative to the school-based learning pathway during the COVID-19 pandemic. The UA Online Academy gives parents an option for their students to learn at home with a curriculum specifically created for online education and fully guided, monitored and supported by Upper Arlington teachers.

Families have the choice of enrolling their student in the UA Online Academy **OR** keeping their student in whichever school-based instructional model in which Upper Arlington Schools is operating. Remote learning will occur as part of these models, including online instruction and remote analog instruction, supplemented, supported and guided by educators.

The District will continue to re-evaluate its plans based on evolving conditions, data about the status of the pandemic, and recommendations and guidance from public health authorities and the scientific community. Flexibility will be crucial as we move forward together in the coming weeks and months.

No matter which learning model is used or selected, the District's mission of educating the whole child remains the same. The district will maintain a relentless commitment to our whole child philosophy, pursuing equitable practices that cultivate the diverse gifts, talents, interests and identities of every child as they learn how to serve, lead and succeed.

The district has clearly communicated its plans to students, parents and faculty in an effort to facilitate cohesion as the community transitions into the school year. Virtual information sessions have been held and are scheduled to share the district's plans and updates with families. The district will be in continuous communication with families and students as circumstances change. Instructional delivery will be supported by Upper Arlington teachers who will be assigned to the online academy full-time. ### Address Student Participation Requirements Here:

- Enhanced Distance Learning will include a set daily structure with multiple Zoom opportunities each day with live teacher interaction.
- Attendance will be taken during synchronous engagements. The “evidence of participation” approach will be utilized for asynchronous situations. Evidence of participation shall be determined consistent with ODE guidance, including:
  - Daily logins to learning management systems.
  - Daily interactions with the teacher to acknowledge attendance (such as messages, emails, telephone calls, video chats or other formats that enable teachers to engage with students).
  - Assignment completion for asynchronous learning. Teachers will determine the number of hours they expect an assignment to take for a typical student and gauge a student’s attendance based on assignments completed.
- We will also take into account that we are all still in the midst of a global pandemic. We will take an inquiry and support based approach to determining participation, knowing that every child has a different lived experience.
- Absences will continue to be tracked in remote settings. Excused absences will continue to be granted, and will be more flexible in light of student/family health circumstances. Flexibility will be given for excused absences due to internet outages or other technological issues.
- Teachers will establish clear expectations to guide students as they engage in remote learning. Students may be offered flexibility on the pace of when the non-teacher-led instruction will occur, which could provide flexibility to students as they navigate the demands on their time when they are not in the classroom.
