Chairperson’s Report Standing Committee Reports	State Board of Education (SBOE) Report – Tony Cochran attended the October SBOE Meeting where the Achievement Committee discussed proposed changes to operating standards and reading competencies and the Accountability Committee provided update on K-3 literacy measures. He spoke to the board during public comment where he shared information regarding the SAPEC. SAPEC appointment to the Office for Exceptional Children’s (OEC’s) Due Process Stakeholder workgroup – Sandee Winkelman. Unmet Needs Subcommittee recommendations and volunteer assignments: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Foster Care unmet need• Third Grade Reading Guarantee definition of significant cognitive disabilities• Records transferring from districts to community schools. This is already addressed in the Operating Standards, FERPA and procedures. Membership Committee Update <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Received 38 applications. The committee has narrowed down the applications based on the categories and geographic areas needing representation. Phone interviews will be conducted and the committee will develop a slate of recommended applicants. The slate will be brought to the panel for vote.• Accepting letters of interest for 2 member-at-large positions. Duties include being part of the executive committee and standing committees. This is a two year commitment. Submit letters of interest to Crystal Ginn by January 31st. Clarification of role/expectations for Ad Hoc Committee work. Each group should assign a Recorder and reporter.</p> <p>SAPEC September 26th meeting evaluation results were reviewed.</p>	
ODE Report	<p>Unmet Need – Paraprofessional Training. SAPEC panel issued a formal recommendation at the last meeting. The Ohio Department of Education Office for Exceptional Children (ODE-OEC) provided an update on actions being taken related to this:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rule 3301-51-09 states that paraprofessional can provide services to children with disabilities. New proposed language added for annual training opportunities and supervision by a licensed teacher. • Development of training modules for paraprofessionals starting in 2014 through OCALI. • House Bill 59 included a requirement for the department to develop a recommendation related to a certificate or endorsement for paraprofessionals and assistants in the area of autism. Meant to enhance training opportunities to understand working with this population. Multiple state agencies came together and developed recommendations submitted to the Governor, Senate and House at the end of October. Development of a tiered system of training and recommendation for mandated training for Autism Scholarship Providers. <p>Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS), Restraint and Seclusion Document Revisions Update</p> <p>SAPEC provided feedback on the frequently asked questions documents at the last meeting and revisions are being made. Resources can be found by searching PBIS on the ODE website such as video modules of training around the policy and rule of Seclusion and Restraint. PBIS specific webpage is in process. Currently training of the regional State Support Teams (SSTs) and Educational Service Centers (ESCs) by Tim Lewis on PBIS, Restraint and Seclusion.</p> <p>State Personnel Development Grant (SPDG) – Parent Professional Partnership Model updates and intended results.</p> <p>When parents and teachers work together, student outcomes improve. Through the 5 year SPDG Grant development of learning sessions that parents and teachers will walk through together.</p> <p>Bowling Green State University (BGSU) Parent Professional Partnership started in 2005 with</p>	

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	<p>the project goal of providing a forum for parents of children with disabilities together with pre-service undergraduate and graduate students to develop strategies for effective parent/professional partnerships and empowerment. The Parent Professional Partnership model in SPDG was modeled after this project.</p> <p>Partnership between ODE-OEC, Ohio Coalition for the Education of Children with Disabilities (OCECD), SSTs and BGSU. Developing a model to establish a parent-teacher partnership process with districts implementing the Ohio Improvement Process (OIP). One district per SST region, each SST region has a facilitator team (1 SST consultant and 1 parent of a child with a disability). Facilitators present 90 minute active learning sessions to the district parents and professionals. Continue building facilitator teams and districts each school year throughout the state over the 5 years of the grant.</p> <p>Outcomes: Establish and maintain effective parent-teacher relations for the purpose of improving student outcomes through participation and relational practices, and focus on strategies for facilitating a partnership approach to all types of parent-teacher interactions, including IEP development, and that can be put into a school improvement plan (OIP)</p> <p>Request for applications being sent to universities to build upon the parent professional partnership in the near future.</p> <p>Third Grade Reading Guarantee (TGRG) Third Grade Reading Guarantee was created by the general assembly to ensure literacy. It has been amended multiple times after conversations between the legislature and the ODE. There are provisions that students with disabilities and English language learners are exempt from retention in third grade.</p> <p>Removed students with significant cognitive disabilities from all provisions of the third grade reading guarantee including diagnostic by Sept. 30, reading improvement and monitoring plan and retention from the third grade.</p>

Vickie Palur motioned to accept the Committee's recommendation to write a letter of support for the Operating Standards, Vickie Clark seconded.
