


Year Two Evaluation Review Findings

Beginning in the fall of 2015 the Ohio Department of Education reviewed 182 Ohio districts in the second cycle of the Educator Evaluation Process Review. Of the 182 districts reviewed 58 were rural, 50 were small town, 34 were suburban, 14 were urban, and 26 were JVSD and ESCs. The complete list of districts is [available here](#). The department reviewed principal and teacher evaluation data from the 2014-2015 school year. The noteworthy findings for both principal and teacher evaluation systems presented here can inform future implementation in Ohio Districts.

Note: Discrepancy in total number of districts reflects Year 1 EEPR districts who are automatically returned to this year's pool for review.

Year Two of the Process Review



The following are the *Areas of Concern*

- Districts reported greater than 25% of their educator evaluations as being not completed
- Districts had less than 75% of Teacher Evaluations completed in eTPES
- Districts had less than 75% of Teachers reported in EMIS were evaluated under OTES and reported in eTPES
- Districts had less than 50% of Principals Evaluations completed in eTPES
- Districts had less than 75% of Principals reported in EMIS were evaluated under OPES and reported in eTPES (**NEW**)

Other Noteworthy Items:

- All required principals were accounted for within OPES

Districts found to be out of compliance were to complete one of the following depending on their unique situation:

- A. Complete Self-Analysis Data Set Questionnaire (see below)
- B. Complete a Corrective Action Plan
- C. Engage with the Department's Office of Professional Conduct
- D. All districts found to be out of compliance return to next year's process review pool
