ReadiStep™ is a standardized national assessment for 8th and 9th graders that measures reading, writing, and mathematics skills. ReadiStep provides students with skills feedback and information about academic progress. ReadiStep will give the first student achievement reference points for measuring student growth. In addition, ReadiStep provides critically important diagnostic information enables districts, schools and teachers to make informed decisions about classroom instruction and intervention that will help prepare students for rigorous high school coursework.

The College Board is a not-for-profit membership organization whose mission is to connect students to college success and opportunity.
