

# Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) Monthly Communication June 2013

This newsletter is distributed by email to the District Test Coordinator (DTC) on record at American Institutes for Research (AIR) and Data Recognition Corporation (DRC). As the DTC, you are responsible for sharing this information, as appropriate, with other staff in your district.

#### **Spring 2013 OGT Rescores and Verifications**

The Test Information Distribution Engine (TIDE) System (<a href="www.ohtide.org">www.ohtide.org</a>) will accept Spring 2013 OGT rescore and verification requests though **June 21**. Results submitted by June 13 will be posted by July 11; results posted on June 14 or later will be posted within 30 days.

Requests for rescores will be subject to Ohio Department of Education (ODE) approval. There will be a \$25 charge for processing each rescore unless it results in a score change and for each verification request. To enter a rescore/verification request in TIDE, click [Create Appeals] on the TIDE home page. Purchase orders (POs) for OGT rescores and verifications should be payable to DRC and faxed to 1-866-377-1249 or mailed to Ohio Customer Service, Data Recognition Corporation, 13490 Bass Lake Road, Maple Grove, MN 55311. The PO number is required for each rescore or verification request. The DTC will be notified via email when the results are available. Note that results will not be posted until the district's PO is received. The DTC can access the results through TIDE by clicking [Appeals]. Printed results will not be sent to the district.

The Ohio Online Assessment Reporting System, OOARS, (portal.success-ode-state-oh-us.info) will be updated at the end of the rescore/verification window if there is a change in a student's OGT score after a rescore. However, no information in OOARS will be updated based on a verification request, and new score reports will not be issued after verifications. OOARS and the state Education Management Information System (EMIS) are **NOT** linked. Districts are responsible for reporting their results to EMIS. Therefore, if a district knows that a student's name is misspelled or that a student mistakenly answered some questions in a subject the student had already passed, the district can simply correct this information before it is reported to EMIS. With the policy of charging \$25 for each verification request, districts should keep in mind that there is no reason to submit a verification request if the district knows what the response will be.

#### Accessing Rescore and Verification Results Memos in TIDE

To access rescore and verification results for OGT, the Ohio Test of English Language Acquisition (OTELA) or the Ohio Achievement Assessment (OAA), log into TIDE and click the [Appeals] tab then [View Appeals]. Select "All appeal types" and "All appeal statuses" from the respective drop-down menus, then click "Search." Results will only be available for rescores or verifications with a Results Posted status. Click the Appeal Identification (ID) number in the left column to open a page with the Appeals Details. Click "Download Memo File" to access a Portable Document Format (PDF) file with the results memo. Note: If a home district enters an OGT rescore or verification request for a Joint Vocational School District (JVSD) student, the DTC must click the "home district" radio button to access the rescore or verification request.

#### Summer 2013 OGT

The Summer 2013 OGT will be administered **June 17 – 30**. Summer testing is optional. Participating schools and districts do not have to offer all five tests. Districts that confirmed participation during the April 29 – May 3 window and successfully entered Pre-ID data during the May 13 -17 window, will have their test materials, including Pre-ID labels, delivered by **June 10**. Make sure the district and school Information Retrieval Numbers (IRNs) reflect where student results are to be reported, not where the students are testing. If the district and school information included on a Pre-ID label is not correct for a student, do not use the Pre-ID label. Call the OGT Help Desk at 1-877-231-7809 (press 2) immediately if you discover any defective Pre-ID labels, or if you are missing labels for any students whose data was successfully submitted with your Pre-ID file. Also, please check your materials upon receipt to ensure you have sufficient quantities for the number of students who will be testing. TIDE will be open through **June 25** for districts to order additional materials and special versions (large-print and Braille test booklets and language translation scripts).

#### **Returning Summer 2013 OGT Materials**

There is **no** automatic pickup of materials for the summer administration. Districts will need to arrange a pickup. Please refer to the *Summer 2013 District Test Coordinator's Manual* for complete instructions. Hardcopies of the *DTC Manual* will be included with Summer 2013 test materials, and a PDF is available at <a href="https://www.ohiodocs.org/OGT.htm">www.ohiodocs.org/OGT.htm</a>. Note that DTCs must ship scorable answer documents for all students who have finished testing during the first week of the test window together. Makeup tests may be shipped separately. Students whose answer documents are returned to DRC by **July 2** will be included in the downloadable data files that are reported on **August 5**.

#### **Summer 2013 OGT TIDE Record-Change Window**

The Summer 2013 OGT pre-processing record-change window will be open in TIDE (<a href="www.ohtide.org">www.ohtide.org</a>) June 10 – July 9. During the record-change window, districts can use the TIDE record-change system to modify Pre-ID data and/or to associate a student's demographic information with the barcode of the generic label affixed to the student's answer document. To access the TIDE record-change window, click [Record Change] and search for the barcode on the generic or Pre-ID label associated with the student whose demographic information you want to enter in the system. This will be the only record-change window for Summer 2013 OGT. There will not be a second record-change window after the answer documents are processed.

#### **Summer 2013 OGT Invalidations**

The Summer 2013 OGT invalidations window will be open in <u>TIDE</u> **June 17 – July 9**. Click [Create Invalidation] and enter the information specified, including the student's name, birth date, SSID (if available), local ID (if available), the subject(s) to be invalidated, and the lithocode of the student's answer document. The lithocode can be found on the bottom right of the front cover of the answer document. Do not invalidate an answer document if you applied a DO NOT SCORE label.

#### **Summer 2013 OGT Reporting Labels**

All districts will receive one free set of reporting labels for the Summer 2013 OGT. You can specify in <u>TIDE</u> until **July 24** whether you want to receive large or small reporting labels. To access this task in TIDE, click [Orders] and then [Reporting Labels]. Districts that do not specify a label size in TIDE will receive large labels. Additional sets of reporting labels can be ordered on the same page in TIDE at a cost of \$.32 per label with a \$60 minimum per school year. If you order additional sets of reporting labels through TIDE, you must fax or mail a purchase order to the OGT Help Desk (fax number: 1-877-231-7813). Reporting label purchase orders should be payable to the American Institutes for Research, Attn: OGT Help Desk, Room 5217, 1000 Thomas Jefferson Street NW, Washington DC 20007.

#### Who Can Take the Summer 2013 OGT?

Summer testing is for students who have completed grade 10 or above; who are in an adult high school program; who have completed curriculum requirements for graduation, but who have not passed all required tests; or who are enrolled in state-approved Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) schools. Only students who were classified as grade 10 or above by June 30 of the preceding school year, or students who are below grade 10 but enrolled in state-approved STEM schools, may participate. Students who are enrolled in school are expected to complete 10 hours of intervention for each subject area in which they will be tested. Students who have completed curriculum requirements for graduation may test without the required 10 hours of intervention.

#### Adult Non-Students Who Have Not Passed the OGT

Adults who are no longer enrolled in any school in Ohio but who have completed all high school requirements and still need to pass one or more of the OGT subject areas may contact any district that is administering the OGT. If adult non-students request an OGT administration, districts must make the testing opportunity available to them per Ohio Revised Code (ORC) 3301.0711(8)(b). These students are to be coded as OGT Only in Box L on page 2 of the answer document. The adult will need to present a photo ID and sign a statement that she or he has completed all high school requirements before she or he will be allowed to take the OGT.

### **Spring 2013 OTELA Results and Verifications**

TIDE will be open through **June 5** for districts to submit verification requests. There will be a \$25 charge for each verification. There are no rescores for OTELA. Purchase orders for OTELA verifications should be payable to American Institutes for Research and faxed to 614-220-9012 or mailed to American Institutes for Research, Attn: Beth Flint, 41 South High Street, Suite 2425, Columbus, OH 43215. The PO number is required for each verification request. The DTC will be notified via email when the results are available. Note that results will not be posted until the district's PO is received. The DTC can access the results through TIDE by clicking [Appeals]. Printed results will not be sent to the district. There are no rescores for OTELA.



#### **OGT Half-Length Practice Tests**

TIDE (<a href="www.ohtide.org">www.ohtide.org</a>) will be open through June 27 for OGT half-length practice test orders. The tests can be used to prepare students for the OGT. The half-length practice tests include these special versions: Braille, large print and English audio CDs. Practice tests will be shipped in September only to districts that indicate in TIDE that they would like to receive them. TIDE will open again for additional half-length practice test orders from September 5 – October 3. Note: Districts that are required to administer the full-length practice tests must download and print the full-length versions from the ODE website.

#### Spring 2013 Alternate Assessment for Students with Significant Cognitive Disabilities (AASCD)

AASCD results will be available electronically on **Saturday**, **June 15**, and printed reports will be available **July 19**. Please note that Spring 2013 AASCD results will be available through the Online Reporting System (ORS), which can be accessed through the AASCD Portal (<a href="https://doi.org/10.2013/journal.airast.org">oh.portal.airast.org</a>). A guidance document for locating and downloading score data will be available on the Test Coordinator Resources page on June 14. There are no rescores or verifications for the AASCD.

#### Changes to the Ohio Downloadable Data File Layout for Alternate Assessment

Ohio's new AASCD was administered for the first time in spring 2013. The AASCD marks a change in Ohio's alternate assessment, which previously consisted of a portfolio-based collection of evidence. This change necessitated revisions to the Ohio downloadable data file layout. Alternate Assessment downloadable data files, which will be released on June 15, 2013, will reflect the following layout changes for the AASCD:

- Raw scores, subscales, conditions, and indicators will not be reported.
- Scaled scores will be reported in the scaled score field, as they are for the regular assessments.
  - o OAA-AASCD's English Language Arts (ELA) score will be reported in the reading field only. It will not be reported in the writing field, as writing is not currently being administered for OAA.
  - OGT-AASCD's ELA score will be reported in the writing and reading fields, consistent with past practice for OGT AASWD.

The updated downloadable data file layout has been posted to ODE's website, <a href="www.ohiodocs.org">www.ohiodocs.org</a> and <a href="www.ohiodocs.org">oh.portal.airast.org</a>. Please notify all personnel who work with your downloadable data file that a new layout is available. Note that the data layouts for OAA, OGT and OTELA have not changed.

#### Guide to the Ohio Graduation Tests for Students and Families (Family Guide)

ODE will no longer be accepting orders for and shipping hardcopies of the *Family Guide*. A color version and a black-and-white version of the *Family Guide* are available on the ODE website and at <a href="https://www.ohiodocs.org">www.ohiodocs.org</a> for districts to download.

#### **Ohio Transition Document**

Districts have questioned which standards the OGT will assess. The standards to be assessed by the OGT are listed in the Ohio Transition document, which has been placed toward the end of this newsletter.

#### **Community Schools and Change of Address**

The Office of Curriculum and Assessment has received notices of address changes from community schools but is unable to assist in the process. All changes of address for community schools must be submitted to the Office of Community Schools (OCS). Prior to a community school attempting to change an address in Ohio Education Directory System (OEDS) the following documents **must be submitted to the Office of Community Schools (OCS)**:

- Copy of a signed and dated school Governing Authority Resolution or Board Minutes verifying the change of location with the new address.
- Updated School Options Enrollment System (SOES) Profile sent to School Finance.
- Sponsor Assurances for the new facility.
- W-9 with new address.
- Vendor Information Form—This document must be signed by the treasurer or authorized fiscal agent.
- Authorization Agreement for Direct Deposit (Electronic Funds Transfer, EFT).

Only after the above documents have been submitted to and approved by OCS may a school initiate a change of address in OEDS.
