HIGHLIGHTS OHIO GRADUATION TEST PRELIMINARY RESULTS MARCH 2006 TEST ADMINISTRATION

INTRODUCTION

The Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) supersede the Ninth-Grade Proficiency Tests as a high school graduation requirement for the classes of 2007 and beyond. The tests were developed in compliance with the requirements of Ohio Senate Bill 1, Ohio House Bill 3, and the Federal *No Child Left Behind* Act.

The tests were administered during the two weeks beginning Monday, March 13, 2006, to tenth graders in Ohio public schools, community schools and chartered non-public schools. Eleventh graders who have not achieved proficient scores on one or more tests also participated, as did some members of earlier classes who are required to achieve proficient scores on the Ninth-Grade Proficiency Tests in order to graduate. A provision of Ohio House Bill 493, signed into law in February 2005, allows these students to meet testing requirements by achieving a proficient score on the OGT in the same subject(s).

The performance standards for the OGT are adopted by the Ohio Board of Education, based on the recommendations of Ohio educators, parents and community members. The standards for the reading and mathematics tests were set after the March 2004 administration, and the standards for the remaining tests were set after the March 2005 administration. Standards for later forms of the tests are maintained through a statistical process called equating. Students must demonstrate performance at the proficient level or above in all five subject areas to meet graduation requirements. The proficient standard is equivalent to a scaled score of 400 on all five tests.

The highlights are based on the preliminary results of the March 2006 test administration. Schools and districts have not verified those results. The final figures may differ due to appeals, late scoring and other changes.

TOTAL STUDENTS TESTED

Table 1 shows the total number of tenth-grade students that took the OGT in March 2006 by subject and school classification. Community schools are included among the public figures.

PRELIMINARY TEST RESULTS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Table 2 presents a summary of tenth-grade student performance on the March 2006 OGT. Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEP) and/or Limited English Proficiency (LEP) are included in the figures. Nearly two thirds (89,057 of 134,008; 66.5%) of public tenth graders who attempted all five tests achieved a result of proficient or above on all five tests. Community school data are included in the public school totals.

PRELIMINARY TEST RESULTS FOR CHARTERED NON-PUBLIC SCHOOLS

Table 4 presents a summary of tenth-grade student performance on the March 2006 OGT. Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEP) and/or Limited English Proficiency (LEP) are included in the figures. More than 88 percent (12,031 of 13,597; 88.5%) of non-public tenth graders who attempted all five tests achieved a result of proficient or above on all five tests.
