GPA Calculation Chart for Alternative Pathway to Graduation

The purpose of this chart is to standardize Grade Point Averages (GPAs) statewide for consideration as part of the alternative pathway to graduation. Points are assigned to grades along a four-point scale, ranging from 0 to 4. A full-letter grade change is equal to one point. Pluses and minuses raise or lower a grade point by three-tenths of a point. Grades are not weighted by type of course taken.

Additionally, any courses taken in the last four years in the subject should be included, unless they were retaken and the grade was replaced. In that case, the grade of record should count.
