

Diabetes Annual Report

Reporting Period: 2023-2024 school year

Executive Summary

[Ohio law](#) requires traditional public-school districts, community schools, STEM schools, and chartered nonpublic schools to annually report the number of students enrolled with a diagnosis of diabetes and the number of diabetic medication administration errors. The Department of Education and Workforce is required to issue a report summarizing the information received.

Diabetic medication administration errors include incorrect administration of insulin such as giving too little, too much, or at the wrong times. During the 2023-2024 school year, public schools and districts reported diabetes information in the Education Management Information System (EMIS), while Nonpublic schools reported in the Nonpublic Schools Data System (NPDS). The Department contacted all schools and districts that did not report in either EMIS or NPDS and requested that they report in a Microsoft Forms tool.

2023-2024 School Year Reporting Results

Number of districts and schools responding to the medical reporting of diabetes care	1,702
Number of students with diabetes enrolled in 2023-2024	7,154
Total diabetes medication errors reported by districts and schools	91

Of the 1,702 Ohio districts and schools that reported diabetes data, there were 7,154 students with diabetes enrolled and 91 diabetic medication errors reported during the 2023-2024 school year.

The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce’s Office of Whole Child Supports provides technical assistance to districts and schools to help reduce diabetic medication errors and collaborates regularly with the Ohio Department of Health’s [School Nursing Program](#) to best support school nurse’s.
