83.3 % (77,778) of career-technical education students scored **proficient or higher** on technical skill assessments.

141,503 students participated in career-technical education courses last year.

91,015 students were **concentrators** in a career-technical education pathway.

96.4 % (41,009) of career-technical education students graduated in **2023**.

A **CONCENTRATOR** is a student who has completed at least two courses in a single approved career-technical education program or program of study. Only one program of concentration can be reported by a district for each student in a year.
