To Whom it may concern,

This proposed update for reporting a student's home language has implications to current practices across the state. In <u>ODEW's guidance</u> (see image below), it says to record the native language as the response from question 2 in the completed Language Usage Survey (LUS). The home language is reported as the response to question 3. We directly import the parents' responses from these questions in registration to our Student Information System directly into the state reported fields. For the high number of students we support, this makes the work seamless and it aligns with current state guidance.

3. **Record.** Indicate responses from the language usage survey in the table below. Refer to the <u>Language</u> <u>Usage Survey Annotations</u> on page 2 for item-specific guidance.
