Good Morning,

Currently, if a course is a CTE course that is eligible for College Credit, the course is coded for the field entitled **CTE College Credit** with the Valid Option of **Y**, *Yes, the course is a CTE College Credit Course*.

If the field is eliminated, how is a course then deemed to be a **CTAG course** and how will it be determined that the course is eligible for receiving college credit?

Furthermore, the Potential College Credit GRAD-003 Report Explanation report states:

WHAT IS CONSIDERED A POTENTIAL COLLEGE CREDIT FOR A STUDENT?

A student may be shown on the (GRAD-003) Potential College Credit Report as having potential college credit in one of the following three ways.

- An AP or IB assessment reported with a test score greater than 1.
- A student is reported in a course included on the College Credit Plus (CCP) file provided by the Department of Higher Education. (Note that the course must have been approved for funding.)
- A student
 - is reported in a course that is identified as CTAG eligible, and
 - scored proficient or higher on the aligned CTE Technical Assessment (ASESMNT_SUBJECT_CODE = GY), and
 - generated CTE FTE in the course, and
 - earned at least partial credit for the course. To have earned full or partial credit in the course the Student Course (GN) Record must have been reported with either of the following.
 1. High School Credit Earned Element (GN150) = 'Y', or
 2. High School Credit Earned Element (GN150) = 'P' and Partial/Override Credit Element (GN152) > 0.

Question: Will the text in RED then be eliminated from the GRAD-003 report explanation?
