Hi,

I have embedded answers in blue text below, I hope this helps:

I have a question about EMIS Change 27-42 for CEP schools. In the past, students who met one of the 4 conditions listed in the EMIS Manual were reported with a "6", and students who did not meet one of the conditions were reported with a "4".

After this new change, will districts still report students who meet one of the conditions with a "6", and report students who do not meet one of the conditions with a "1"?

If you read through the added reporting instructions, you'll see that reporting "1" and "6" are equivalent. We're keeping option 6 to make reporting a little easier for districts by minimizing the required updates. If a student does not meet one of the 4 conditions, then they would not be reported as having an economic disadvantage.

Additionally, if a student's family turns in a paper form indicating they meet the requirements to be considered disadvantaged, should CEP schools report those students with a "6"- even if the CNDC module does NOT indicate that?

If a student meets one of the 4 conditions, they should be reported with either "1" or "6". Again, these two options are equivalent.
