Hi,

Thank you for the additional time to report this GC data for dual enrollment for CTAGs during the Initial window but the GC part of the EMIS manual said these dual enrollments credits cannot be reported unless the colleges transcribes.

Valid Options

00.00–99.99

Reporting Instructions. Include all dual enrollment credits earned through dual enrollment courses—offered through dual enrollment or statewide articulation agreement—that appear on a student's transcript or other official document, either of which is issued by the institution of higher education from which the student earned the college credit. Credits transcribed by a college after the student has left secondary education can be included on the record as long as the work (such as through a CTE course or an AP or IB course and test) was completed before the student graduated from secondary education.

Career-Technical Assurance Guide (CTAG) credit eligibility should not be reported as dual enrollment credit earned. Only report CTAGs that are confirmed to have been transcribed upon enrollment in a postsecondary institution.

Only report a record with 00.00 in this element if a student has no credits earned but needs a Student Graduation—Core Summary (GC) Record reported for elements GC080–GC110.

Often times the colleges do not transcript until mid-year causing the transcripts not to be generated until January (which is after the close of the initial).

If the dual credits need to be transcribed to authorized the EMIS reporting, the delay will prevent districts/CTE from reporting. Is there documentation that the student can fill out to get credit for LEAs to report? What is the recommended way to get this information from students? From the College? When K-12 staff have no rights to this student college level data?

Could this transcribed credit be populated in the ODDEX CCP module by populated data from HEI and display the transcribed GC related data?

Hi,

Thank you for your comment. We do not believe that districts must receive a transcript and are aware that for many (if not most) of CCP situations, they don't get a transcript. The point of the reporting instructions is to make it clear that the college has to give the credits- not just that the student has the potential to get credits. The Department cannot specify how they can collect this or what documentation is required- they just need to have reasonable confidence that credit was awarded.

At the OAEP conference, David Ehle stated that if a student responded on an exit survey that their college had accepted their CTE/CTAG courses as college credit, then we could report the dual enrollment credit in the follow up report on the GC record in FY27. The EMIS manual for GC states that in order to report dual enrollment credits, they must be documented on a transcript or other document from the college where the credit was earned. Can you clarify if there has been a change in the documentation requirements?

We have tried to report CTAGs as dual enrollment credit in the past but have run into roadblocks since the colleges cannot share information with public districts due to privacy concerns. It is difficult to get students to share copies of college transcripts. If we do not need to have a document from the college to report the dual enrollment credit, this would help with our reporting. Can you confirm?
