F-1	Who should be the Point of Contact (POC)?	<p>The POC has high-level responsibilities such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Delivering Batch File data for their ITC or School District(s) they are responsible for servicing • Providing SSID User Account information for their ITC or School District(s) they are responsible for servicing • Providing Tier-1 Help Desk Support • Submitting questions related to the SSID functionality to IBM and distribute the answers to the appropriate party <p>For instance, one site structured this POC to be one person at the ITC (example NWOCA) to handle all of these responsibilities for all the Districts they service. Thus the individual School Districts communicate with this one POC and the POC will then provide this information to the SSID Application and IBM. All communications will then be returned back to the POC for distribution to the appropriate parties.</p> <p>When new POC information is received, IBM will forward the information to Ohio Department of Education and Workforce (ODEW) to verify that these individuals are authorized users for the SSID System and are individuals that should have the POC responsibilities. Once this verification process is complete, each POC will have an SSID User Account created.</p>

F-2	Who should I contact if I have questions related to the SSID?	<p>All questions related to the SSID system should first be directed to your Point of Contact (POC) at your ITC or School District.</p> <p>The Point of Contact (POC) should submit a help desk ticket through the SSID system. Once the answers are returned to the POC's, the POC should distribute the answers to their users. In addition, the context of the questions should only be about the <i>functionality</i> of the SSID Application.</p> <p>If a person does not have access to their Point of Contact (POC) at the ITC or School District or access to the help desk functionality within the SSID system, the SSID Questions email address may be used.</p> <p>All other inquiries dealing with the list above will be told to contact their POC at the ITC for further assistance.</p> <p>The email for questions related to the SSID application is:</p> <p>SSIDHelp@us.ibm.com</p>	
F-3	How do I get an SSID User Account? How can user accounts be deleted? How can a User Role be changed?	<p>All requests for new User Accounts, modifications, or deletions to User Accounts should only be submitted by the POC at the ITC or Independent School District. All New User Accounts and updates may be requested by entering a help desk ticket through the SSID system. Please refer to F-4 in order to determine what information is required to obtain an SSID User Account.</p>	F-4

F-4	What information is required to obtain an SSID User ID and Password?	<p>The following information is required before a user can be granted an SSID User ID and Password:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Role – Read-Only, Data Entry, Data Entry Administrator, or Administrator • First Name • Last Name • Email Address - This is the primary email address that will be used in conjunction with the SSID. This is very important if the user will be submitting Batch files via TLS email. • District IRN - The district this person is servicing or if multiple the primary district the person is servicing. This could also represent the district where this person is located. • Building IRN - The building where this person is located. 	F-3
F-5	How do I access the SSID website?	<p>The SSID website is a secured site so you must access the site by typing "https://" before the URL. Since most web browsers default to "http://" – a non-secure connection – you will not be able to access the site by just typing in "www.ohiossid.com". Therefore, the SSID Application can only be accessed through the secured SSL encrypted website – https://www.ohiossid.com.</p> <p>Only personal computers (PC) and Apple Macintosh computers, with valid IP addresses will be able to connect to the application over existing links at the ITCs and School Districts. The verification of IP addresses by the SSID System will only allow users to access the</p>

		<p>SSID application from an approved school district or ITC. The user will not be able to access the SSID application from a home computer or from a computer at an unapproved location.</p>	
F-6	<p>What should I do if I am not able to access the SSID website?</p>	<p>Make sure you are typing the correct URL with "https" and <u>not</u> "http". If you do not type https before the address you will get a page cannot be displayed error message. Please note that most browsers default to HTTP. Please try clicking on the following link to access the site. https://www.ohiossid.com. If you are still unable to access the site by clicking the above link, then you should contact your POC at your ITC or School District to confirm if your workstation is authorized to access the SSID web site.</p>	
F-7	<p>Who should I contact if we have new IP Addresses for a district?</p>	<p>This information may only be provided by the POC at an ITC or Independent School District. A list or range of approved IP addresses is needed to make sure that only secure connections can take place. We only allow the approved list to access the web site and for districts / schools.</p>	
F-8	<p>How do I obtain the secure VPN if I am not accessing the website from a valid IP Address, i.e. AOL or MSN?</p>	<p>Since you are outside the approved network, you will need to download and install a VPN client to access the SSID site. You should contact your POC at your ITC for assistance with obtaining and installing the VPN Client.</p>

F-9	What should I do if I forget my SSID User Name or Password?	If you forget your SSID User Name and/or Password, click on the "Forgot Your Sign-In or Password?" link on the SSID logon page - https://www.ohiossid.com . You will then be prompted to enter your Last Name, First Name, and Email address in order for your User Account information to be emailed to you. This information will need to match the information that you provided to us originally for your User Account.	F-10
F-10	Why am I getting the message "Incorrect User Information Entered Or Your Account Is Inactive" when I use the "Forgot My Username Link"?	First, make sure that the Last Name, First Name, and Email address you are typing on the website is the exact same information (especially the Email Address) that was provided by your ITC or POC for your original User Account request. If you are still unable to retrieve your User Name or Password please contact your ITC or POC for assistance. If your email address submitted by your ITC is different than the email you use on a day-to-day basis, please contact your ITC to submit the change.	F-9
F-11	Is it possible to get a list of usernames and passwords for all of our users at our ITC or School district?	We cannot provide a list of all of your district's User IDs and passwords for security reasons. Users should utilize the 'Forgot Your Sign-In or Password link' on the SSID Website.	F-10

F-12	Who should submit batch files?	School Districts should determine their procedures for submitting data for the SSID Application. For instance, if the school district currently uses an ITC to submit EMIS information, they may want to use this same means to submit data to the SSID Application. However, the SSID Application provides the flexibility to allow the school district to also submit data directly to the system. Whatever is determined by the School District should be communicated to their respective ITCs, if applicable.	
F-13	Can more than one district's information be submitted in one batch file or should they be split into individual files by district?	Batch files do not need to be split by district. An ITC or School District has the option to either combine all student information into one batch file or split the information into as many batch files as desired. The SSID Application will accept either option.	
F-14	What is the format of the batch file?	The ITCs / School Districts (dependent on the procedure put in place) should produce SSID Batch Input Files in accordance with <i>Attachment Two</i> .	
F-15	How do I submit batch files?	<p>There are two methods for submitting batch files to the SSID Application:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Online through the SSID Application <p>The Administrators at the ITCs and the School Districts will be given User IDs and Passwords to access the live SSID</p>

		<p>website – https://www.ohiossid.com</p> <p>Through this site the user will be allowed to access the all functionality on the website. The user may use the SSID website to upload and download submit Batch Input and Output Files.</p> <p>2. Secure FTP methodology</p> <p>In order for the POC at the at the ITCs and the School Districts to use this Batch submission method, the ITC or School District must have the ability to transfer Batch files through Secure FTP (SFTP). Before a user may access the IBM SFTP site, IBM must create a user home directory and user account information as well as open up access to the site for the designated user IP address.</p>	
F-16	Do I need to send an email each time I upload a batch file through the SSID Website? Will you notify me by email when my files are ready for download?	No. You do not need to email us each time you upload a batch through the website. The upload process through the website is automated so that we will know when we have files ready to process. We will process those files overnight and then the next day you will be able to download the output file though the website. An automated email will be sent out notifying you that your output file is completed and ready for download.

F-17	How should I name my batch file?	<p>The input and output files should follow the following file name formats:</p> <p>Input File Name Format: ITC / School District + Date (yyyy) e.g. NWOCA20020603.txt.</p> <p>Output File Name Format: ITC / School District + Date (yyyymmdd) + Job ID e.g. NWOCA20020603_JobID_100.txt.</p> <p>You must uniquely identify each file that you submit. If you submit more than one file on the same day please distinguish between the two files. For example,</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • NWOCA20020603a.txt. • NWOCA20020603b.txt. 	
F-18	I received a message stating that IBM was unable to process my batch file as a result of a format problem. What would have caused my batch file not to process correctly?	<p>Please check your file for the following errors:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Incorrect Header Row <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ The User ID contained in the header row of the batch input file must be your SSID User ID ➤ The District IRN and Building IRN contained in the header row must contain the leading zeros and must be the IRN numbers associated with your SSID User Account 2. Data is outside quotation marks for a field (Ex. - ;"JDoe"001,) 3. Data is not enclosed by double quotes - the second quote is missing (Ex. - ,"JDoe,)

F-20	<p>Why is the export batch file not in the same order as the import file we sent?</p>	<p>Your Batch File is processed in the order it is provided and we return to you the output file with the same data that we were provided plus any new or returned SIDs and the Result Code for each record. This output file may not be in the same order as the batch input file depending on if there are failed records.</p> <p>The Vendor ID field should be used to identify the record in your system. You should decrypt the Vendor ID field and sort the file based on those fields before you begin your processing.</p>													
F-21	<p>What are the reasons that my records may have failed in my batch file and received Result Codes of 'F'?</p>	<p>The following are the reasons that your records may have failed and received Result Codes of 'F':</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Birth Place City Empty or Null • Middle Name Empty or Null • Ethnicity Empty or Null • Native Language Empty or Null • Admission Reason Code (9th Mandatory field) Empty or Null • Date of Birth greater than current date • DoB Format Invalid or Null • FirstName, Last Name, or Middle Name Contains Invalid

F-23	What fields are required to create an SID for a student?	Any Batch Files submitted <i>to create SID's for students</i> or any SID that is created online requires 9 Mandatory elements. The 9 Mandatory Elements for a student include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Legal Last Name • Legal First Name • Date of Birth • Gender • Legal Middle Name • Birth Place City • Language • Ethnicity • Admission Reason

		<p><i>*If the user is associated with Department of Higher Education (DHE) or Department of Developmental Disabilities (DODD), the Legal Middle Name, Birth Place City, and Native Language are not mandatory.</i></p> <p><i>**If the user is associated with Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS), the Legal Middle Name, Birth Place City, and Ethnicity are not mandatory.</i></p>	
F-24	<p>What do I do if a student does not have a Legal Middle Name listed on the birth certificate?</p>	<p>If a student does not have a Legal Middle Name, an asterisk (*) should be placed in the Middle Name field to indicate that the student does not have a Middle Name. The Middle Name will be the only exception of the nine mandatory elements since a student may not have a legal Middle Name. The system will not allow the Middle name field to be Blank, thus the user must submit an asterisk.</p>	
F-25	<p>If a user wishes to provide the Mother’s Maiden Name field, should it contain the mother’s full name (first name, middle name, and maiden name)?</p>	<p>The Mother's Maiden Name field should only contain the Maiden Name.</p>	
F-26	<p>What do I do if a student’s name on a birth certificate contains quotation marks (Ex. Jan”ee, or Jan”ee”) or slashes (Ex. Ja/n/ee)?</p>	<p>We recommend that you strip the double quotes and/or slashes. After the quotes/slashes are stripped, replace the first quote/slash with a space so that the name shows as – Jan ee or Ja n ee</p>

F-27	Should we include known prefixes and suffixes for a student?	We recommend that all known prefixes and suffixes (ex Jr., III) be removed during the extraction process. Since the suffix is not consistently used with a student's name during the registration process, submitting the suffix may actually hinder the accuracy of the matching process. This does not mean that you need to remove the prefixes and suffices in your SIS System. The prefixes and suffixes should be stripped during the extraction process.	
F-28	What do we enter if a student has two middle names?	If both names are on the birth certificate, you should enter both names in the middle name field. The Middle Name field in the SSID System allows for multiple names to be entered.	
F-29	What do we need to do if we have a student whose name has been changed legally due to the adoption?	For all name changes and other changes in identifying student attributes, please use the <i>Modify Student Information</i> maintenance function on the SSID website. You will need to know the Student's SID, Last Name, First Name, DoB, and Gender. Additionally, you may submit a batch file with the SID and the updated name. As long as the SID and the last name, first name, or date of birth is in the original state the changed field will be updated in the database.	
F-30	What does the "District IRN" stand for? Is this the resident	The District IRN is initially populated with the District IRN of the School District who created the SID. Since we assign SIDs on a first

	<p>district, the attending district, or the district created the SID?</p>	<p>in first out basis, the first District submitting the student record will be assigned the SID. We do not differentiate between the resident district and attending district.</p> <p>School Districts will always have the opportunity to modify and update the District IRN field as students transfer or move from district to district. However, please keep in mind that the District IRN field, as well as all of the other additional information in the SSID Application, is as only as up to date as users of the SSID System maintain the data. So if the District IRN is never updated as a student moves from district to district, the District IRN field may be the original School District who created the SID.</p> <p>In addition, the District IRN field is not a required field to be submitted to generate an SID. The SSID Application is not a tracking system and is only used to assign unique SIDs for students. The District IRN field is only used to provide additional information for the online user. The District IRN is not used in the matching process.</p>	
F-31	<p>Is there a way for a school district to obtain all their SSIDs via your website? OR could you provide the district with all their SSIDs?</p>	<p>The School District could use the SSID website to search for individual SIDs for a student. You could also submit a batch file for only that School District to query the SSID System for the SIDs for the students in their district. Since you would be querying the system, you could mark the Existing Student Code with a 'Y', to only search for existing SIDs rather than creating a new SID if a match does not exist.</p>

		<p>There are currently no reports in the SSID System that will allow for the district to obtain a list of SIDs for their school district. This is based on the guidance given by ODEW and the Attorney General.</p>	
F-32	<p>What should I do if I have entered all of the possible SID attributes when searching for an SID online and I am not able to narrow down my search? We do not have access to the SSN or Mother’s Maiden Name.</p>	<p>If you have entered all known student attributes and are unable to narrow down your search and a potential match still exists, contact IBM SSID Support. Please create a help desk ticket providing the Student Attributes entered on the ‘Modify an SID Screen.’ IBM will work with you to determine the issue and resolve any duplicate SIDs.</p>	
F-33	<p>I tried searching for a student through the SSID website that received a Result Code of ‘C’ through the batch process. Why am I able to pull up the student through the website but an SID was not assigned through the batch process?</p>	<p>The Batch Process works slightly differently from the online process since the online process is interactive. The Batch Process assumes that the User is attempting to create a new SID unless the record has an Existing Student Code of 'Y' or the record contains the SID. The batch process does not stop matching on the four mandatory elements when creating a New SID. This reason for this is because the system needs to verify the additional optional elements in order to determine whether or not it is an existing student or a new student.
