## Secure Data Center

[Ohio Revised Code](#) and [Ohio Administrative Code](#) require districts to report data to EMIS and to verify and approve all EMIS data. Data should be reviewed and verified prior to the close of the [different data collections](#). This verification should include all relevant reports, including those in the Secure Data Center (SDC).

The Secure Data Center (SDC) is an interactive tool that allows districts to review data well before the data is final and the Report Cards are released. ***The SDC is the main resource districts should use to review Report Card Data.***

To access the SDC, log in to [your OH|ID account](#) and select the Report Portal tile. If you do not have the access needed to view the SDC, work with your district's OEDS administrator.

The [Secure Data Center – Status of Reports](#) webpage includes a listing of the reports included in the SDC and the years for which the data is available. This is the page to review to determine which data for the coming report card is currently available.

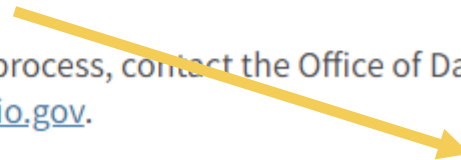

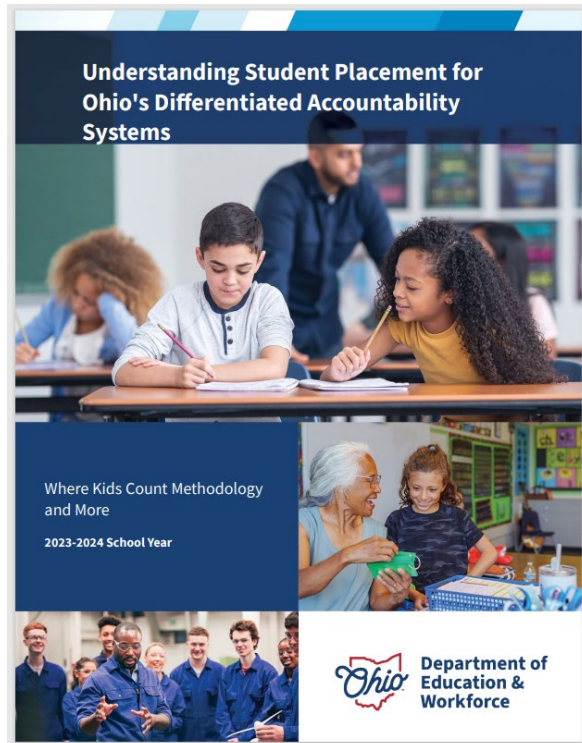

# Traditional Report Cards

Ohio's Traditional School and District Report Cards provide valuable information about the performance of schools and districts. The Overall Ratings for Local Report Cards reflect the collective performance of schools and districts across various educational components. The elements of these ratings include:

Schools and districts interested in additional resources can view this [reference video](#) or click on the [resources below](#).

- » **Star Rating System:** Schools and districts are rated on a scale of 1 to 5 stars, with half-star increments, providing a clear and accessible measure of performance. A 5-star school is higher performing than a 1-star school.
- » **Five Key Components:** The overall rating is based on the performance in five [components](#): [achievement](#), [progress](#), [gap closing](#), [early literacy](#), and [graduation](#). Additional information about [post-graduation readiness](#) and [technical documentation](#) round out these components and provide a full picture of district and school performance.
- » **Reform and Transparency:** This rating system was introduced as part of a reform to enhance transparency and accountability in Ohio's education system. To learn more, visit the following resources:

## ACHIEVEMENT

The Achievement Component Technical Document provides a comprehensive guide to understanding how academic achievement is measured in Ohio's traditional district and school report cards. It details the two measures used: the Performance Index and the Performance Indicators, with the former being used to assign the Achievement Component Rating. The document includes an overview of measures, business rules, calculation methods, and detailed inclusion criteria, ensuring transparency and clarity in the evaluation of student performance on Ohio's State Tests. It serves as a crucial resource for educators and administrators in interpreting and utilizing report card data effectively.

The Performance Index measure as defined in [ORC 3302.01\(A\)](#) and [3302.03\(D\)\(1\)\(c\)](#) uses the performance level results for students in grades 3 through high school on Ohio's State Tests. The Performance Index score accounts for the level of achievement of every student, not just whether they are "proficient." Each test a student takes is assigned an achievement level based on the test score with higher test scores resulting in higher achievement levels. On the Performance Index, the higher performance levels receive larger weights in the calculation – but all achievement levels are included. More information about test achievement levels is available annually in the [Understanding Ohio's State Tests Reports](#) guidance document.

The Performance Indicators measure ([ORC 3302.02\(A\)](#)) is a report-only measure within this component – meaning the data does not factor into the rating determination. The Performance Indicators measure reports the percentage of students scoring proficient or higher on each of Ohio's State Tests disaggregated by grade level and subject.

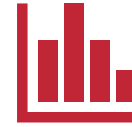

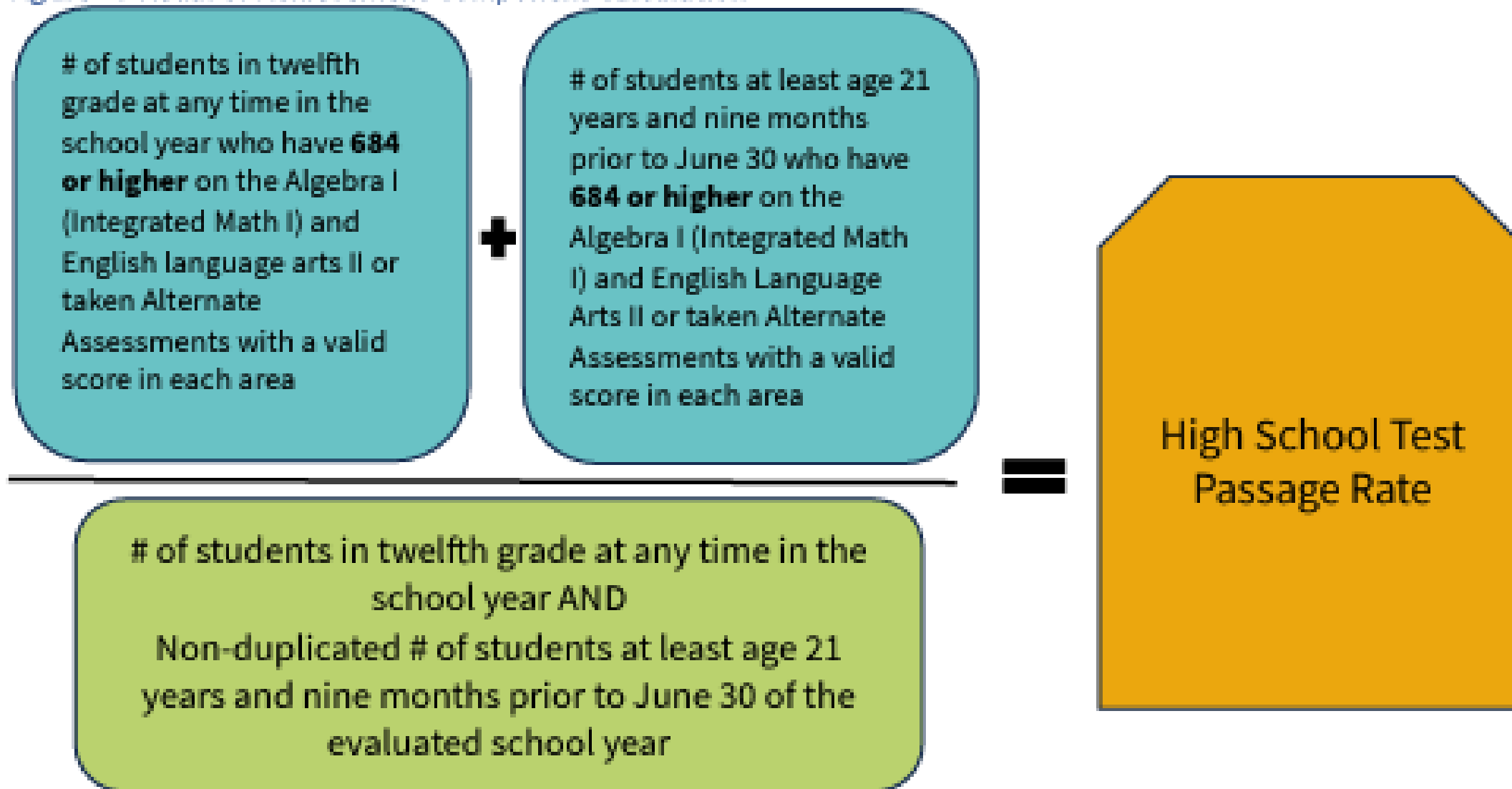

### ☀ Retained/Promoted Status Element

Record Field Number	FN070
Definition	Indicates if a student was retained or promoted at the end of a school year and whether he/she will advance to the next grade level.

#### Valid Options

P Student was retained at the end of the previous school year due to the Third Grade Reading Guarantee, but was not retained because of parent/guardian request as outlined in Ohio law.

**Reporting Instructions.** This element is only reported for students in Grade 3. Report the option that best describes the student’s retention status as of the first day of the current school year. If a student is subject to retention in grade 3 based on Third Grade Reading Guarantee reading requirements and state assessment results, report the student’s retained status with options “A”, ~~“D”~~, ~~“N”~~, “P”, or option “5”.

For any grade 3 student promoted due to adequate performance on a Third Grade Reading Guarantee Alternative Assessment, report the option that identifies the specific alternative assessment taken—options “J”, “K”, “L”, “M”, or “N”. The full names of the Department-approved Third Grade Reading Guarantee Alternative Assessments can be found on the Department’s website. For students demonstrating adequate performance on a Third Grade Reading Guarantee Alternative Assessment who are retained for other reasons, report option “5”.

Report option “\*” only for students who have met the reading requirements in the Third Grade Reading Guarantee by obtaining the required promotion score on any administration of the state 3rd grade reading assessment and have not been retained.

Students who do not meet the reading requirements but are exempt from retention [due to a provision](#) in Ohio law should be reported using the option that best identifies why the student is exempt: options “D”, “E”, “F”, ~~“G”~~, or “P”.

## Graduation Component

The Graduation Component Rating is assigned based on the weighted graduation rate. The weighted graduation rate combines the four- and five-year graduation rates into a single rate. When a school or district has both a four- and five-year rate, the four-year rate is weighted at 60% and the five-year rate is weighted at 40%.

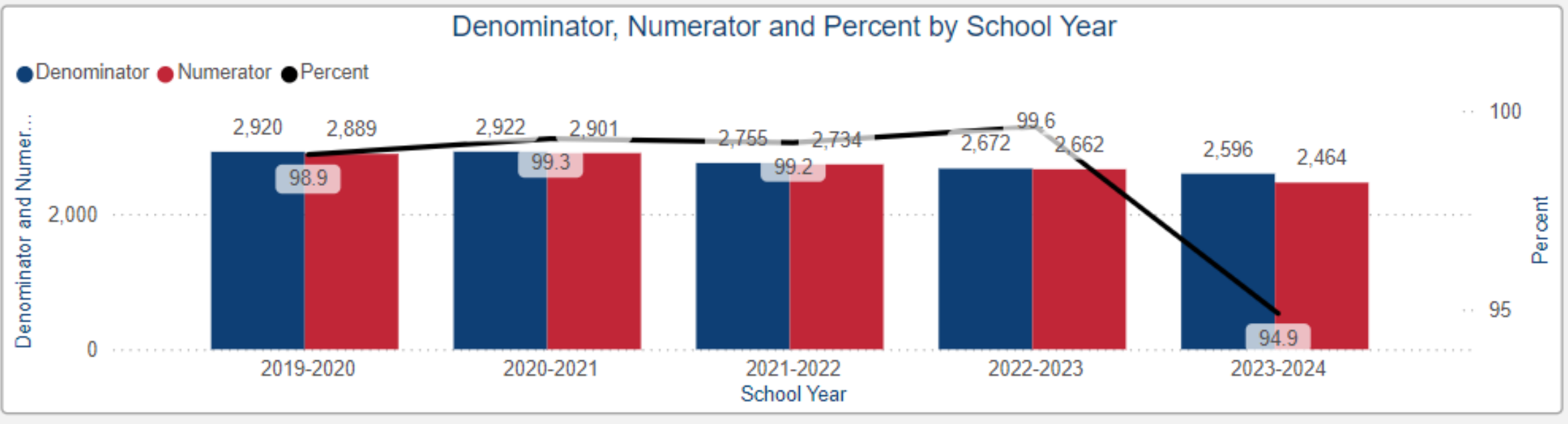

# WHY DOESN'T THE OHIO SCHOOL REPORT CARD MATCH THE CENTRALIZED REPORTING SYSTEM?

- The Centralized Reporting System (CRS) and The Ohio School Report Card will almost never completely align
- Data in the CRS is the “*raw*” data
- Data on The Ohio School Report Card is the “*polished*” data
- There is no communication between the two systems

## CENTRALIZED REPORTING SYSTEM

- Identify students who took the state assessments
- Used for planning services
- Register students to test
- Deploy tests to students
- Questions about TIDE and CRS go to the **Office of Assessment**  
(statetests@education.ohio.gov)

## OHIO SCHOOL REPORT CARD

- Reported through EMIS
- The Ohio Department of Education and Workforce does not use vendor data with a few exceptions
- Business Rules Applied
- Questions about The Ohio School Report Card go to the **Office of Accountability** or **EMIS**

# WHAT STUDENTS ARE ACCOUNTABLE TO MY DISTRICT?

- Measures/Components rely on enrollment rather attendance
- Does not matter how many days the student is absent
- Depends on Eligibility Criteria used for the measure or component

# FULL ACADEMIC YEAR (FAY)

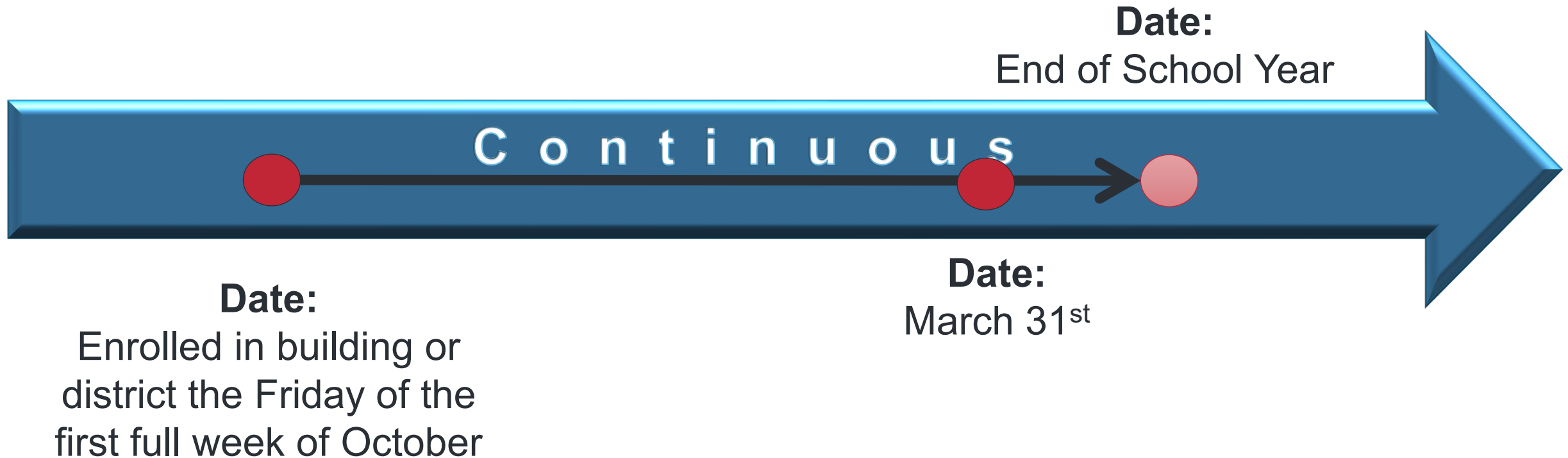
- Continuous enrollment in the school/district from the Friday of the first full week in October (formerly called October Count Week) through March 31<sup>st</sup>
- Modifications to the FAY are used in the ***Early Literacy Component***

Enrolled in the building or district by the Friday of the first full week of October

# GRADUATION COHORT

- Placed in a cohort based on the grade level reported when reported in a public school with a grade of nine (09) or higher for the first time
- Assigned to last district/school where enrolled

# POSSIBLE ATTENDANCE

- At least 100 hours of possible attendance (i.e. enrolled for at least 100 hours)
- Count in any district/school where they meet enrollment threshold

# WHEN ARE RETAKES INCLUDED?

# WHEN ARE RETAKES INCLUDED?

- Different Criteria for High School End of Course (EOC) exams vs. Grade 3-8 tests
- **High School EOC Exams**
  - Test counts one time in a school year (highest attempt)
  - Does not count when taken in a subsequent year
- **Grade 3-8 Exams**
  - **For retained students** - second-year tests count with a few exceptions (Early Literacy Component)
  - Highest attempt in Grade 3 ELA is used



# WHEN ARE RETAINED STUDENTS INCLUDED IN THE EARLY LITERACY COMPONENT?

- **Proficiency in Third Grade Reading**
  - Retained students **are not** included
- **Promotion to Fourth Grade**
  - Retained students **are** counted in the denominator, but not the numerator
- **Improving K-3 Literacy**
  - Students retained in Kindergarten – 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade **are** included in the measure
  - Students retained in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade **are not** included during their second year of 3<sup>rd</sup> grade

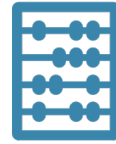

# WHEN ARE ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS INCLUDED?

- **Enrollment**

- Students reported as English Learners (**L, S, Y**)
  - **L** – Classified as English Learner and enrolled in U.S. schools where English is the main language of instruction for 1st year
  - **S** – Classified as English Learner and enrolled in U.S. schools where English is the main language of instruction for 2nd year
  - **Y** – Classified as English Learner and enrolled in U.S. schools where English is the main language of instruction for more than 360 school days (two school years)

# WHEN ARE ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS INCLUDED?

- **Achievement**

- Students enrolled in US schools for less than 2 years (L, S) are excluded

- **Progress**

- Students enrolled in US schools for less than 2 years (L, S) are NOT excluded

- **Early Literacy**

- Students enrolled in US schools for less than 2 years (L, S) are excluded



# WHEN ARE ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS INCLUDED?

- **Gap Closing**

- **PI** – Students enrolled in US schools for less than 2 years (L, S) are **excluded**
  - Students that have exited the program between 1-4 years ago are included in the English Language Learner Subgroup
- **Progress** – Students enrolled in US schools for less than 2 years (L, S) are **NOT excluded**
  - Students that have exited EL Status between 1-4 years ago are included in the English Language Learner Subgroup
- **Participation Rate** - Students enrolled in US schools for less than 2 years (L, S) are **NOT excluded**
- **English Language Proficiency Improvement Indicator** - Included after 2 consecutive years of OELPA tests
