


ACHIEVEMENT COMPONENT So What? Here's What. **Now What?** Here's the data. So, what does the Now what do we data tell us? do?



HERE'S WHAT

- The Achievement component is comprised of the High School Test Passage Rate measure.
- Represents the number of students who meet applicable criteria on assessments that are required for graduation


Achievement Component

How Does this School Compare to the Other Dropout Recovery Program Schools in Ohio?







For the 2023-2024 Report Card, a student is at least 21 years and nine months if their birthdate falls between October 1, 2001, and September 30, 2002.

Originally, students needed 18 points across seven tests Now, students meet same requirements as 2023 and Beyond below

Class of 2023 and Beyond

EOC Exams Score of 684

- Algebra 1 (or Integrated Mathematics 1)
- English Language Arts II



ALTERNATE ASSESSMENT

- Students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities
- Must take all four assessments
 - English language arts
 - Math
 - Science
 - Social Studies
- Must have a valid score for all four assessments

During COVID, students could use a course grade in lieu of using a test score and these do count in the calculation using this crosswalk




Data Manager Reports

- Data Manager sends reports directly to schools twice per week during the EMIS reporting through Data Collector
 - 20xx_RPTCRD_DPR_Assessment_Pass_Rate_SSIDs_<file date>.xlsx
 - Each report will have the SSID of the students and whether they are included in the denominator and/or numerator.
 - A second worksheet includes the Calculation information with the percentage of passed tests as well as how many tests taken and the number of passed tests.








SDC ACHIEVEMENT COMPONENT
