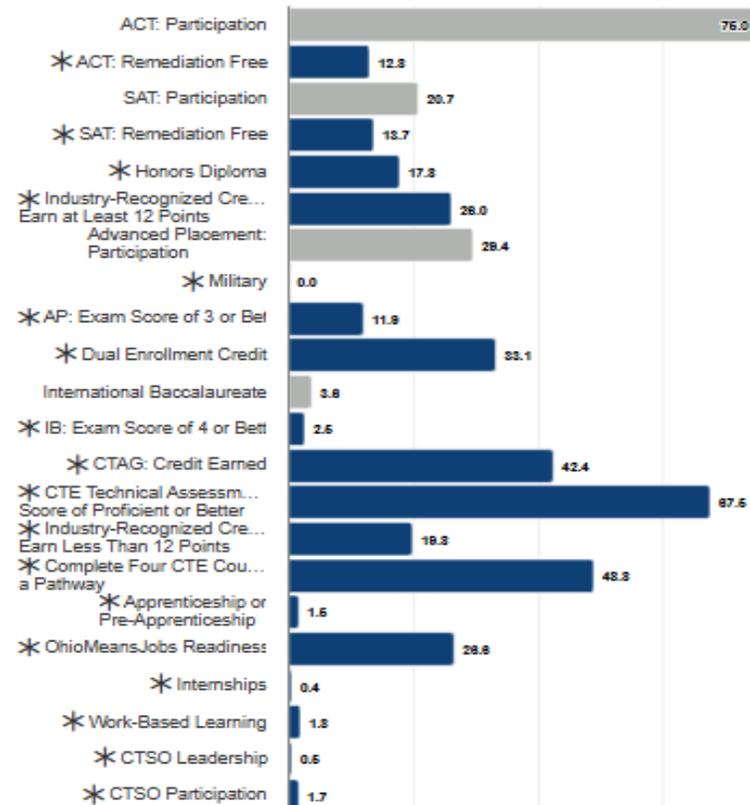

# ***WHAT DOES THE READINESS MEASURE OPTION 1 MEASURE?***

- For a student to earn a full point in readiness measure option one, one of the four Career & Post-Secondary Readiness elements needs to be achieved. After completion of a Career & Post-Secondary Readiness element, a student may earn a bonus of 0.33 points by completing at least one Work-Based and Service-Learning element

# WHAT DOES THE EMERGING READINESS MEASURE OPTION 2 MEASURE?

- For a student to earn a full point in the emerging readiness measure option, a combination of 3 elements between the two categories needs to be achieved. At least one item must be earned from each list. Bonus points are earned by achieving a fourth element from either list. Partial credit of 0.33 or 0.67 also can be earned

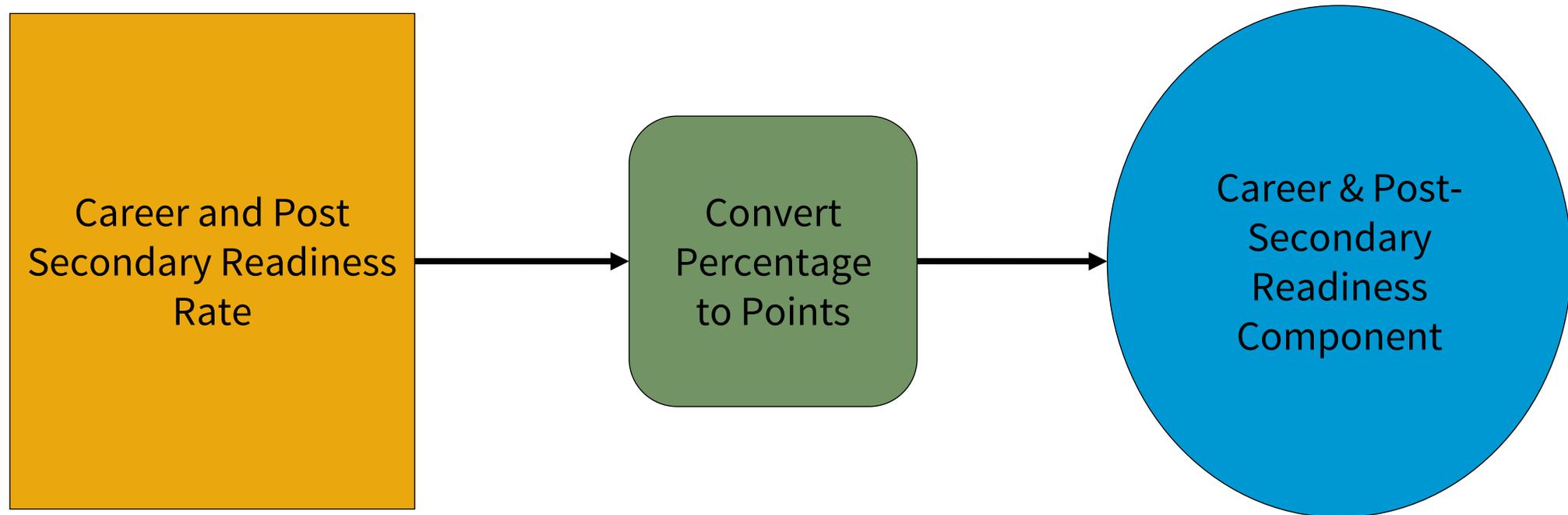

These work environments foster in-depth, firsthand engagement with the tasks required in a given career field

Enhances students' employability and career readiness

Are aligned to curriculum and instruction



## When

When students are identified as ninth graders, they should start accumulating work-based learning hours aligned to:

- Program of study
- Graduation plan
- Student success plan

Students may accumulate hours across multiple types of work-based learning experiences.

Example: Evergreen Local is part of a Compact CTPD with one other district. Evergreen Local accidentally reported 12pt Industry Recognized Credential records for 10 concentrators with a non-passing score (N). As a result, those students did not contribute points to the component.

# VALIDATE ACCOUNTABILITY BUSINESS RULES



## CAREER & POST-SECONDARY READINESS

Evaluates key metrics of success for students in Ohio. The Career Readiness: Focuses on preparing students for future careers, ensuring equitable outcomes for all. The Post-Secondary Readiness assesses students' preparedness for further education beyond high school. Includes career-tech and advanced coursework options, work-based learning, and industry-recognized credentials. This component is crucial for understanding how well CTPDs are equipping students with the necessary skills and knowledge for their future endeavors.

# ***REQUIRED OEDS ROLES AND SECURITY PROCESS***

- To obtain access to the Secure Data Center (SDC) a user must be assigned either the **Secure Data Center – Standard Level Access** *or* **Secure Data Center – Student Level Access** roles in [OEDS](#)
  - \*\*Either role will grant the user access to student-level data within the reports
- Security is now based primarily on the IRN as the driver.
  - When logging into the Report Portal system, users will be prompted to select from one or more IRNs to view reports
  - For example, users may be assigned access (via the OEDS SDC role) at the District IRN, School IRN, or a combination of both
  - Users with access to data from multiple IRNs must select the highest level in their hierarchy of access (i.e., District level) to view reports for the entire district

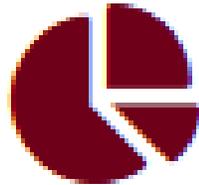

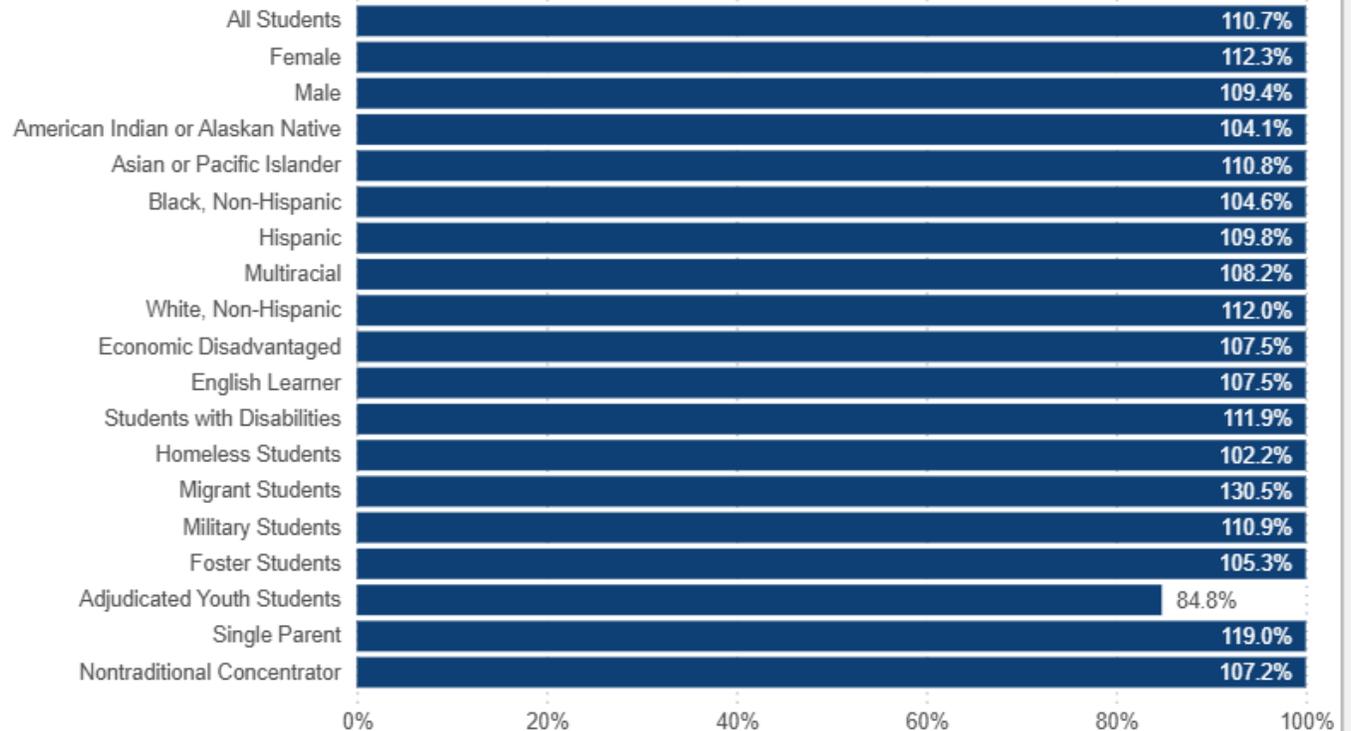

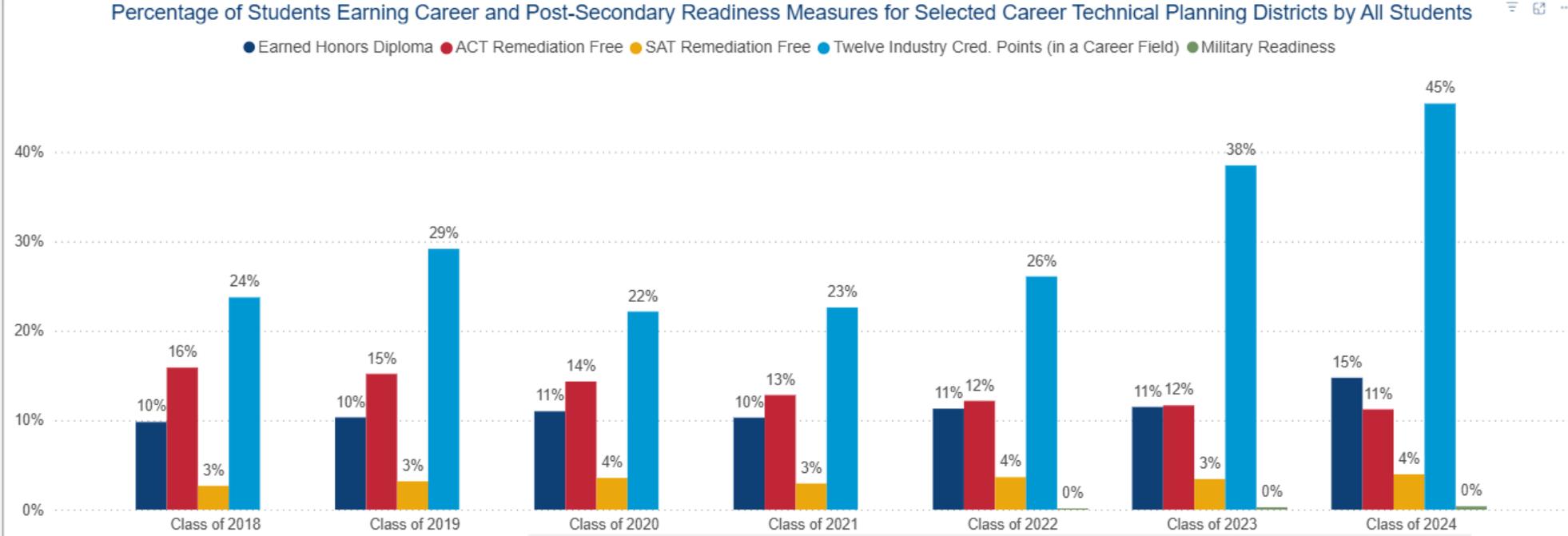

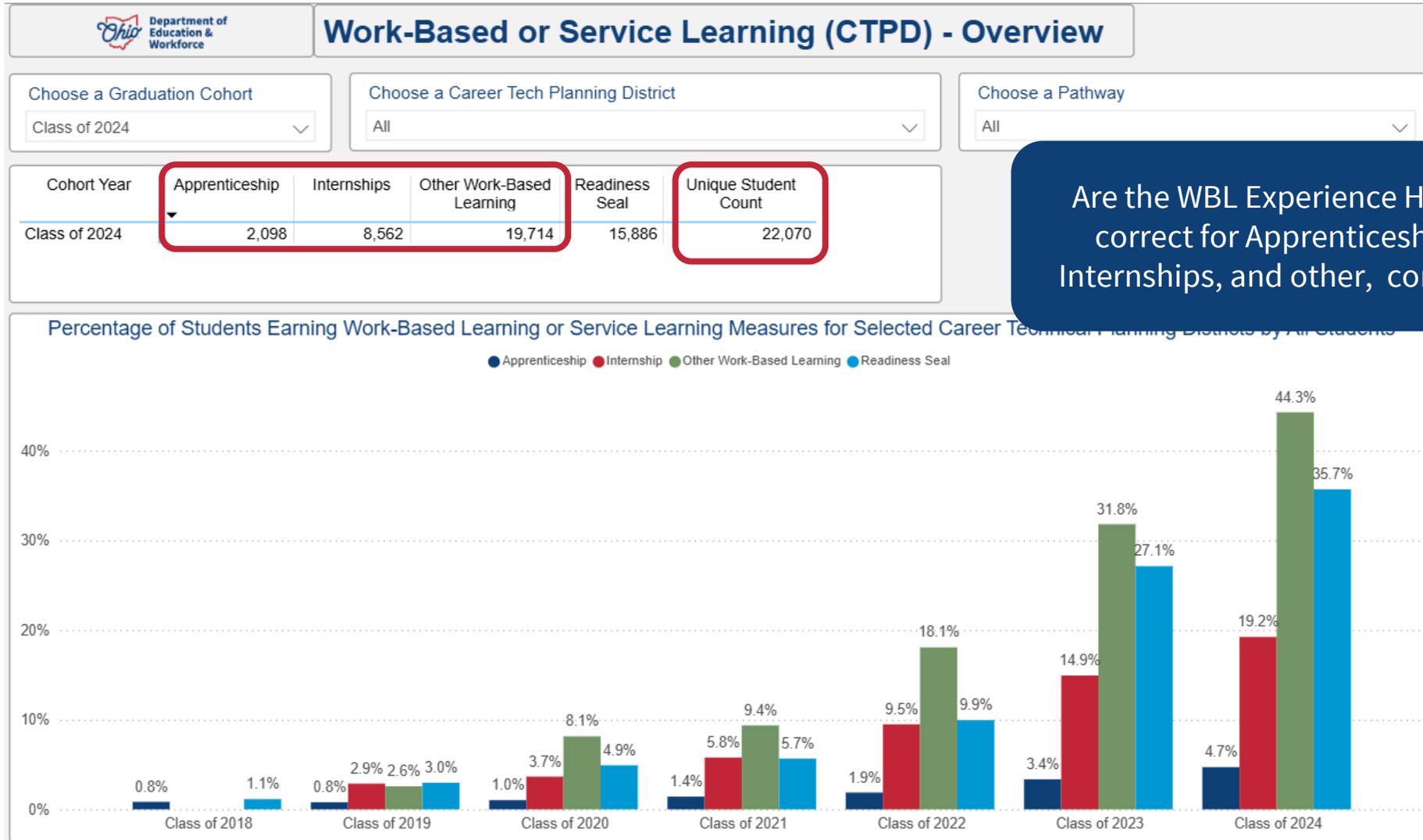
