HOW ARE CERTAIN GRADUATES COUNTED?

EARLY GRADUATES

- Early graduates count with their Graduation Cohort (i.e., if a student began 9th grade in the fall of 2020 and graduated in the spring of 2023, they would count in the 2024 Graduation Cohort)
- Early graduates have until their anticipated graduation date to show post-secondary readiness.

“SUPER SENIORS”

- Grade 13 or 23 students must demonstrate post-secondary readiness by their 4th year in high school.
- Demonstrations of post-secondary readiness earned after the 4th year of high school is not included in the calculation.






