#### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

REWARDS Secondary is a research-validated, strategic reading intervention designed to give students in grades 6–12 new skills to unlock grade-level content-area text. The short-term, targeted intervention is supported by explicit, systematic, teacher-led instruction to provide students with a flexible strategy for decoding long words and increasing oral and silent reading fluency.

The REWARDS acronym stands for Reading Excellence: Word Attack and Rate Development Strategies. The strands of reading instruction addressed in REWARDS are Decoding, Encoding, Fluency, Vocabulary, Comprehension, and Writing. Of these strands, decoding of multisyllabic words and fluency (rate development) are the dominant strands, and explicit instruction is a key to the success of this intervention.

REWARDS can be used as a supplement or intervention to any core instructional program in whole-class and small-group settings. It can also be implemented as an after school/extended day program, as an elective or special reading class, or as part of a summer school program. Designed as a six-week intensive course with lessons delivered daily, REWARDS Secondary is for students who are at a third-grade decoding level or above. The 20 lessons can be implemented in 50–60 minutes per lesson. The amount of time to complete each lesson varies greatly depending on the size of the group, the competency of the students, and the pace of the teacher.

REWARDS includes procedures, materials, graphs, and rubrics for assessing and monitoring. An optional online data management system that includes class rosters for teachers to enter assessment scores and add/delete students as needed. If a teacher chooses to not utilize the optional online data management system, REWARDS Teacher's Guides include several resources, including charts and graph templates, to record and manage student data from pretests and posttests.

### PROGRAM ALIGNMENT WITH THE SCIENCE OF READING AND STRATEGIES FOR EFFECTIVE LITERACY INSTRUCTION

REWARDS is based on the Science of Reading and developed by reading specialists. The program guides students through the proven steps of reading instruction with ageappropriate content that develops their reading and listening skills as they move through more complex content across multiple curriculum areas. Students are supported by REWARDS explicit, systematic, teacher-led instruction, and application of skills to real-world content.

- Encoding and Decoding: Students read and spell multisyllabic words in each lesson and learn a strategy that can be generalized to what they would do when spelling long words independently.

- Fluency: Methods are incorporated into REWARDS to accelerate gains in reading rate: 1) students are taught decoding skills so that they can quickly decode unknown words; 2) students practice reading words more quickly by rereading lists of words that they have accurately decoded; and 3) students engage in repeated reading exercises by reading a portion of a previously read passage for one minute and determining the number of words read.

- Vocabulary: REWARDS includes a substantive vocabulary section incorporating proven practices: 1) explicit instruction on selected words accelerates vocabulary growth; 2) before passage reading begins, students learn domain-specific vocabulary words directly related to the content in the passage; and 3) Students are taught two-word learning strategies to help determine the meaning of unknown words.

- Comprehension: All the strands in REWARDS contribute to reading comprehension. Passage reading exercises provide student practice but are also designed to provide teachers with a model for informational text reading that can be transferred to other materials. There are many strategies for close reading. Teachers must select a strategy that matches the text. Teachers decide whether scaffolding questions should come before higher-order questions which require integration of evidence from the passage.
