





Accelerating Learning in Mathematics

- Online differentiated learning opportunity to accelerate math learning for middle school students.
- All Ohio districts and schools serving students in grades 6-8 will have access to Zearn Math at no cost from January 2024 to June 2025.

Accelerating Learning in Mathematics (continued)



- Zearn Math offers access to a full K-8 math library of more than 1,000 digital lessons.
- All digital math lessons help students access grade-level math learning with built-in, differentiated support.
- Zearn Math is a top-rated math learning platform to help all students catch up and move forward in math.

State-Funded High-Dosage Tutoring

- The General Assembly recently directed \$26.1 million in Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) funding to support the implementation of high-dosage tutoring programs in Ohio districts and schools.
- The tutoring programs will be offered by providers on the [High-Quality Tutoring Provider \(HQTP\) Vendor Directory](#) and funded through the Department. Tutoring programs will be offered at no direct cost to participating districts or schools.

Key Components of High-Quality Tutoring

All vendors listed in this directory responded to a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) indicating that they provide a comprehensive tutoring program that includes the six “Key Components of High-Quality Tutoring,” including:

- Use of instructional materials aligned to Ohio’s Learning Standards;
- Instruction aligned with research on effective teaching and learning;
- Integration of high-dosage tutoring practices;
- Use of data-driven instruction;
- Hire and train quality tutors; and
- Demonstrated effectiveness.

Participation Criteria

1. Use a provider on the High-Quality Tutoring Provider Vendor Directory
2. Assign a staff member to serve as a liaison between the selected vendor and oversee program implementation
3. Tutoring during the school day preferred
4. Align to guidelines for recommended dosage by selected vendor (high-dosage tutoring practices)
5. Use student data to identify and prioritize student participation
 - Participate in general research and evaluation activities

Considerations

- Demonstrated need supported by data
- Connection to current local initiatives and broader systems of support
- Capacity to implement a high-dosage model selected

Timeline and Next Steps

- Learn about tutoring providers
 - Provider information available on HQTP webpage
 - Provider informational webinars
- Request to Participate: open Aug. 7-15
- Tutoring start date: Oct. 1, 2023
- Tutoring available through Sept. 30, 2024

Prioritization

- Districts, community schools and chartered nonpublic schools are eligible
- Priority for students most impacted by the pandemic

Incentive Funds

- Ohio was one of only five states awarded a grant by Accelerate, a national nonprofit, to drive continued student recovery from the pandemic through evidence-based tutoring models.
- Districts and Schools implementing literacy tutoring programs will be eligible for incentive funding to support high-fidelity implementation of tutoring programs.
