

<b>Elements of Explicit Instruction</b>	
<b>Content</b>	1. Focus instruction on <b>CRITICAL</b> content.
	2. <b>BREAK DOWN</b> new material (complex skills and strategies) into smaller steps (obtainable chunks).
<b>Design of Instruction</b>	3. Design <b>ORGANIZED</b> and <b>FOCUSED</b> lessons.
	4. Begin lessons with a clear statement of the lesson <b>GOALS</b> .
	5. <b>REVIEW</b> prior skills and knowledge before beginning instruction.
	6. Provide step-by-step demonstrations ( <b>I DO</b> ).
	7. Provide guided practice ( <b>WE DO</b> ).
	8. Check for students' understanding ( <b>YOU DO</b> ).
<b>Delivery of Instruction</b>	9. Require <b>FREQUENT RESPONSES</b> .
	10. <b>MONITOR</b> student performance closely.
	11. Provide immediate affirmative and informative (corrective) <b>FEEDBACK</b> .
	12. Deliver the lesson at a <b>BRISK PACE</b> .
<b>Practice</b>	13. Provide judicious <b>PRACTICE</b> (deliberate, retrieval & spaced).
